

Our membership's direct business activity supports more than 58,000 total Alaskan jobs and \$4.6 billion in total wages annually.


#### Generous



#### **President Biden Job Approval**


Do you approve or disapprove of the job Joe Biden is doing as president?








Do you support or oppose the following item as part of a larger package to address the state budget deficit?



## Do you support or oppose a state constitutional amendment to put in place a spending cap on state spending?




