PART I

Grant Funding Allotment

Proposal: The City Clerk's Office has formally – and successfully- made a request for a portion of CARES Act Funding, which has been allocated to the City of Rochester. This funding will spearhead efforts to parse out money to local businesses who are licensed through the City of Rochester in an effort to assist them through the challenging economic period that has arisen due to the COVID-19 pandemic and its associated economic shutdown.

There are around 300 businesses of varying types that are licensed by the City Clerk's Office. These include Massage Therapy Businesses, Taxi Cab Franchises, Trade and Contractor Businesses (such as Sidewalk Contractors) and Liquor Businesses (Restaurants, Bars, Hotels etc.). We are outlining the breakdown of grant spending based on the \$500,000 amount approved and allocated by the Rochester City Council: The fee breakdown you see below occurs if the absolute maximum individual business allotment is reached by 106 liquor licensees and 80 other business types.

This means that the total businesses served number found below is the minimum amount that each grant allows.

——— WHO IS INCLUDED?

Liquor Business = Hotels, Restaurants, Brew Pubs and Taprooms, Exclusive Street Bars, Clubs, Baseball Teams, Theaters (For-Profit and Non-Profit) and Consumption and Display Institutions.

Other Businesses = All other licensees served by the City Clerk's Office. These include: Massage Businesses, HVAC Contractors, Pawnbrokers, Taxicab Companies, Sewer and Sidewalk Contractors. Mobile Food Unit Operators, Vending Cart Operators, Sign Contractors and Tree Contractors.

GRANT PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS AND TERMS

- Qualifying businesses must be located within the City of Rochester municipal limits and
 must be a City of Rochester licensee with a valid current license. Maximum amounts are
 set by having paid license fees and also by the classification of your license type. The
 maximum grant amount awarded is not to exceed \$4,000 for Liquor and \$1000 for other
 businesses.
- The grants can be used for any funding that is related to COVID closures, impacts and expenditures. This could be things such as purchasing Plexiglas, paying rent arrears or staff and any costs to outfit businesses to operate in the new COVID-19 landscape.
- These grants are for business entities and not for individuals.
- Businesses not based in Rochester, or businesses not licensed by the City Clerk's Office of Rochester are not eligible. Exclusive Off- Sale liquor stores are also ineligible for this grant.







PART II

Licensee Liquid Funds Grant Overview

Re: Liquor:

The Grant will be open to all valid and current City of Rochester Licensees with business operations located in the City. This grant amount will be allocated based on the fee paid and point systems below and will operate on a first come first served basis.

Payment of liquor fees and license type classification will determine what the maximum amount a licensee is eligible for.

Allison Del Luna is a Certified MN Veteran.


Allison's Bar and Grill has 63 employees.
