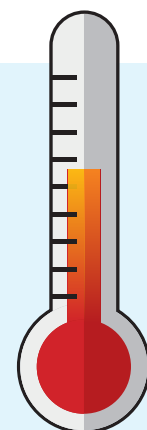

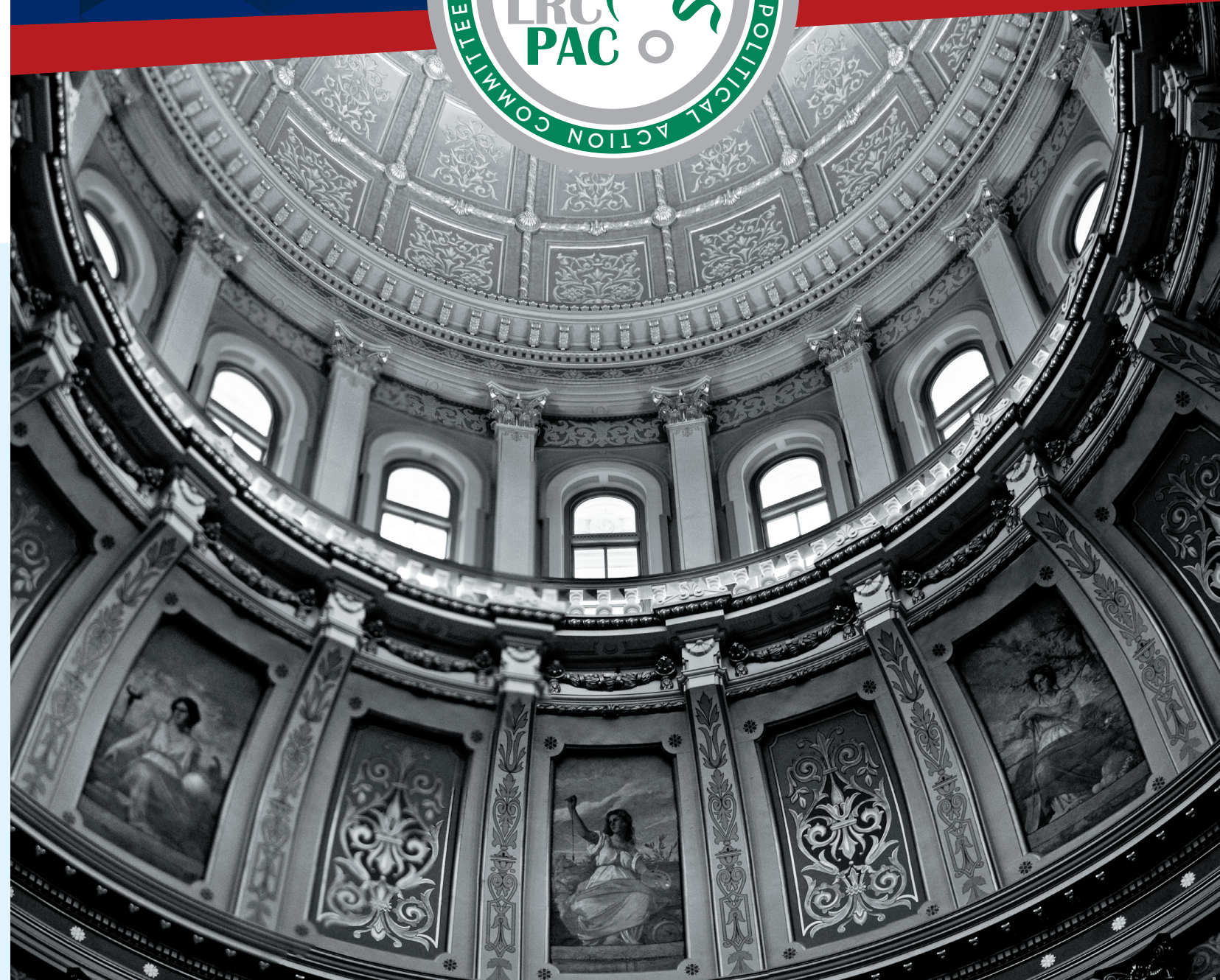

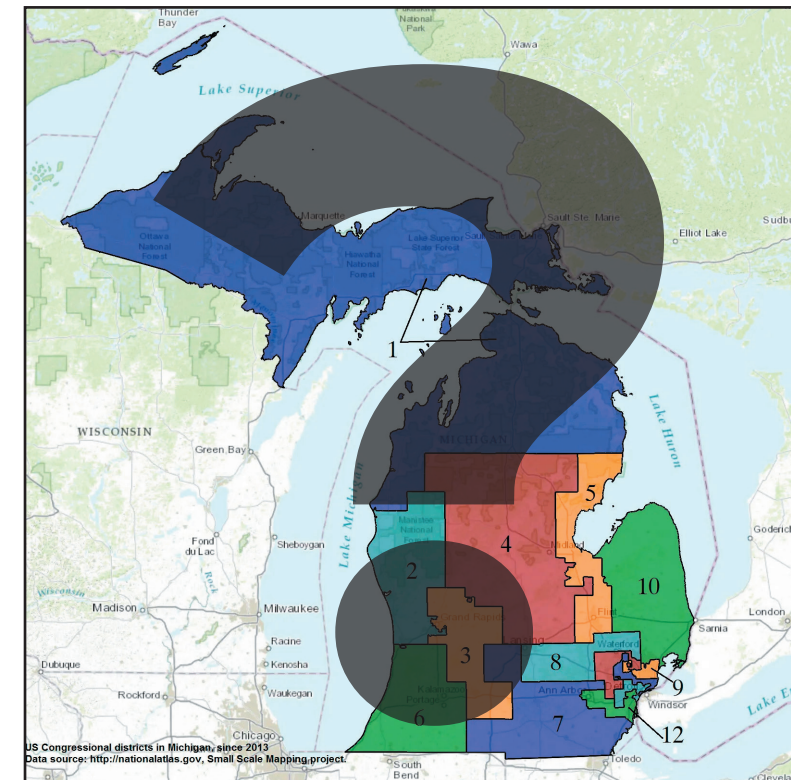
Of course, we believe all our candidates will win on Tuesday, Nov. 2, but to make sure this happens, candidates will need to maintain a strong ground game, including targeted mailers to absentee voters and hitting as many doors as possible. The election for many of these candidates will be won or lost on mismanagement of time and resources.

REDISTRICTING COMMISSION UPDATE

In 2018, Michigan voters supported Proposal 18-2 that established the Michigan Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission (MICRC). MICRC is comprised of 13 citizens from across Michigan and their role is to lead the redistricting process to draw fair and independent maps.

How were the commissioners chosen? They were randomly selected from over 9,000 applicants. They include four people who affiliate with the Democratic party, five Independents who do not affiliate with either major party, and four who affiliate with the Republican party.

When is the MICRC expected to finish its work? The deadline is Nov. 1. However, due to the delayed release of the 2020 Census data, it is unknown

when the MICRC will complete its redistricting work. Under federal law, the Census data should be provided to the states by April 1. However, according to the U.S. Census Bureau, it is scheduled to be released Sept. 30.

Why this process matters? It matters who represents the business community at the federal, state, and local levels, and it's the role of the LRCC to be the voice of business. The LRCC has been closely following the MICRC process, including hosting MICRC commissioners at
