Washington DC Summit, Sept 9-11 Update

This year's Washington DC summit was the most thorough ever for the Corona Chamber of Commerce. Staying two blocks from the White House, our meetings at the US Chamber of Commerce included extensive overviews of economic policy, regulatory changes, and energy policy that effect your operations. On Capitol Hill, in the House of Representatives we met with the widest group of leaders ever including Rep. Ken Calvert, Rep. Mark Takano, and Rep. Paul Cook on issues ranging from health policy to business development. In the US Senate, we discussed Corona 2020 with key staff for both of California's Senators Dianne Feinstein and Kamala Harris. And with our groundbreaking work with the Navy, Admiral VerHage gave our group an extensive review of the incredible growth of responsibility and employment at NAVSEA Corona and that base's critical role in the Navy's Innovation Ecosystem.

Our group will be meeting with the widest group of individuals yet to introduce the incredible success of Corona 2020 in attracting employers and jobs to the area and managing the benefits of the commute time savings.

Dean Seif shared observations on meeting with the chief economist for the US Chamber of Commerce and USC's work with the Department of Commerce on enforcement of tariffs, and laying the wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown on 9/11. Marisa Yaeger discussed the introduction of the Higher Education authorization bill has been introduced in the US Senate but not been brought up in the House.

Sacramento Legislative Update

The Legislature adjourned session since our last meeting and the opportunity for the Governor to act on legislation that has been passed runs for another few weeks. We will quickly have a round table update on some of our legislative issues we have been tracking and trends that developed in the closing days of the legislative year (California's legislative session encompasses two calendar years with the Legislature doing its work during the January - September work period usually).
