Summary

- We are growing, but slowly, and we are less dense than peer communities.
- Young workers working in Orange, and driving into Orange, is increasing.
- Household income is out-pacing inflation.
- Orange has number 1 in per capita income but lags in per capita sales.
- Retail gap remains wide with additional retail opportunity on the horizon.

Summary

- CHCCS continues to out perform peers.
- Minority student reading is improving in CHCCS and the achievement gap is closing there.
- Health Indicators show Orange and Chatham lead neighbors and peers.
- Rent is getting more expensive, but wage growth is outpacing it.

- Housing prices are increasing, though rate of growth in Orange is slowest
- Orange and Chatham properties are valuable and have a strong and growing tax bases.
