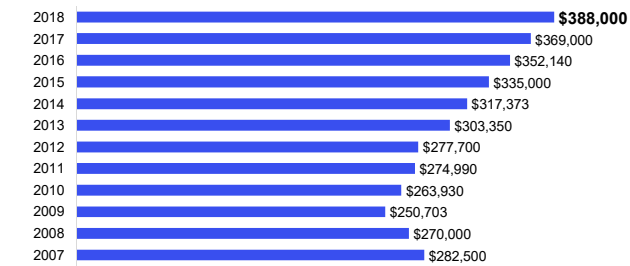
Median Year Orange County Homeowner Moved Into Unit vs. 2013 for renters

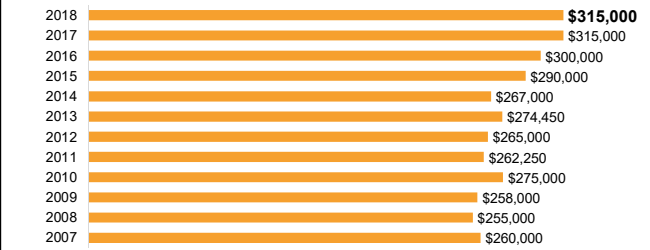

Gross Rent Paid, ACS 2013-2017



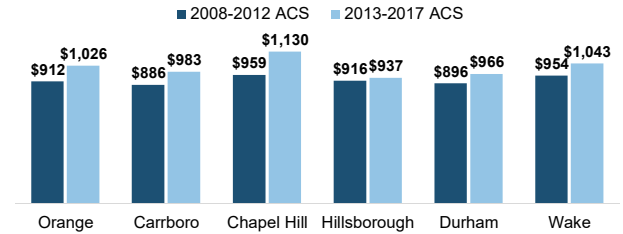

Median Rent, 2012 vs. 2017



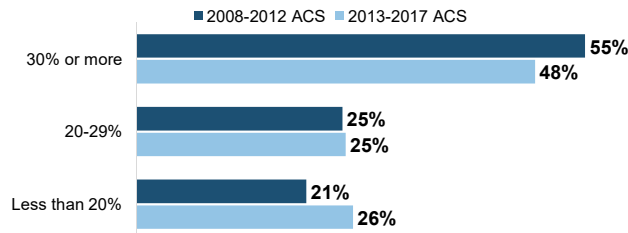

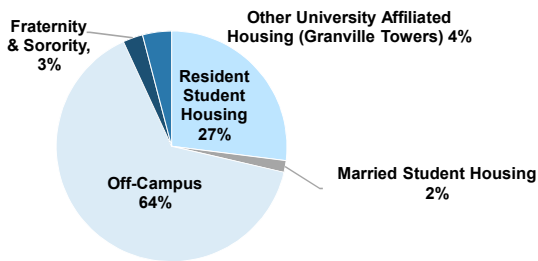

UNC Student Enrollment by Housing Type (2017)



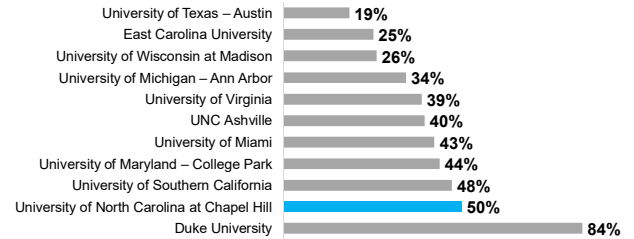

Top 10 Chatham County Industries by 2016 Sales (in millions)

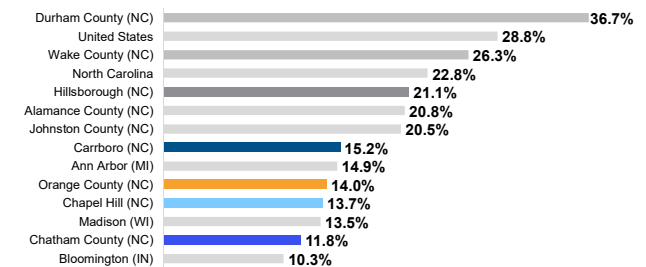

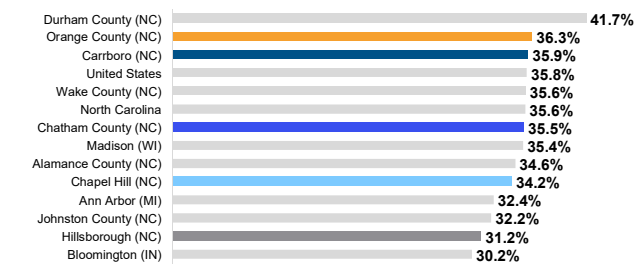

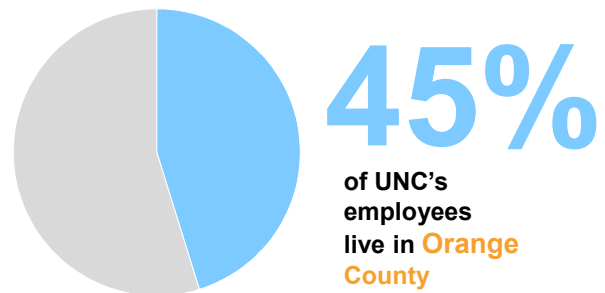

Female Business Ownership Rates (2016)



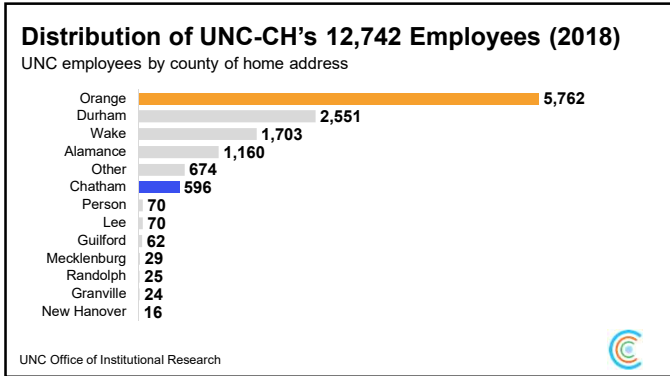

Change in number of workers from 2007-2017



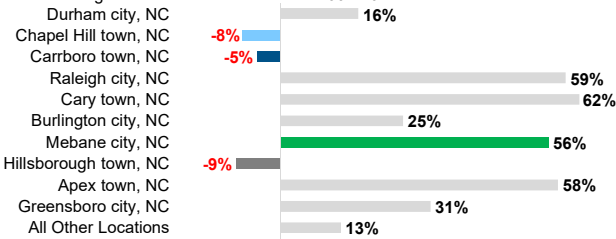

Percent change in number of workers from 2007-2017

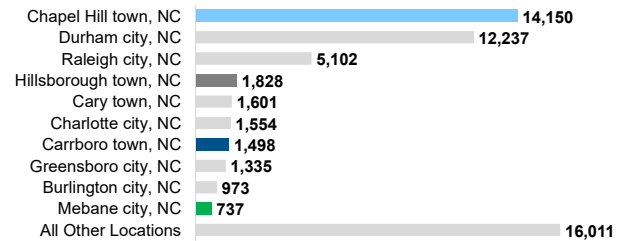

Change in number of workers from 2007-2017



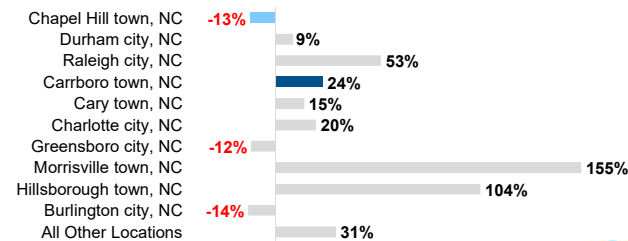

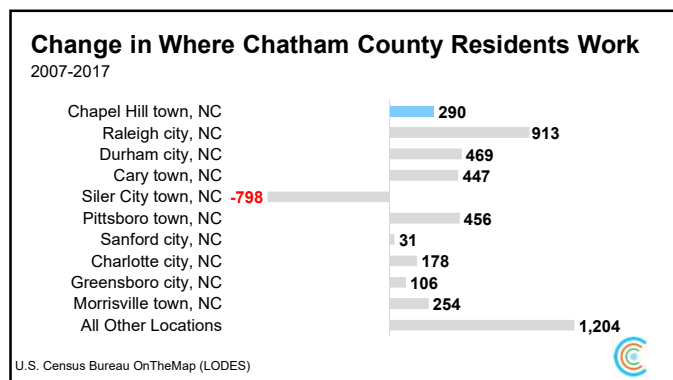
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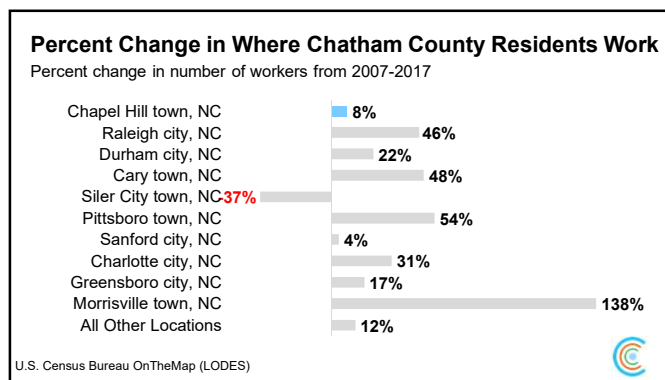
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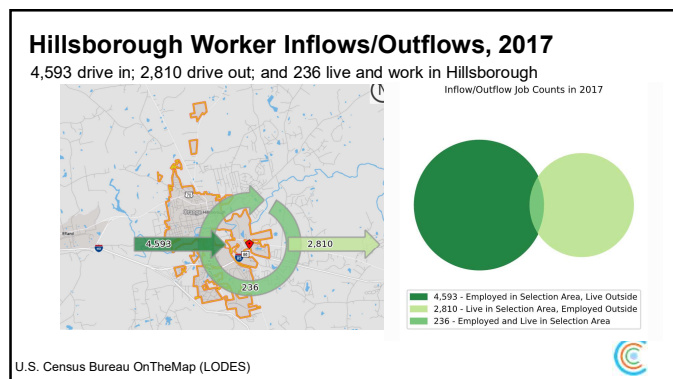
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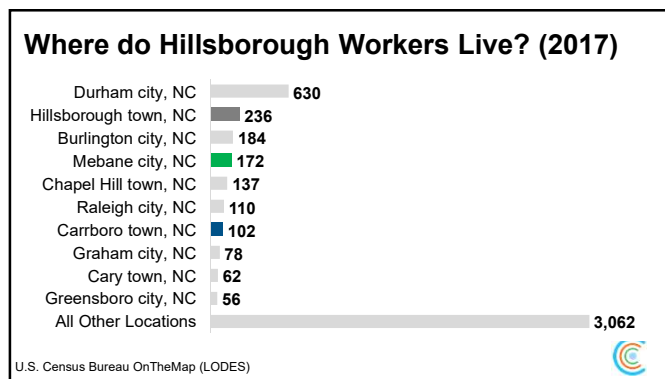
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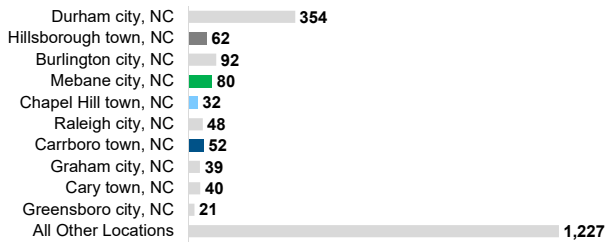
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Change in Where Hillsborough Workers Live

Change in number of workers from 2007-2017



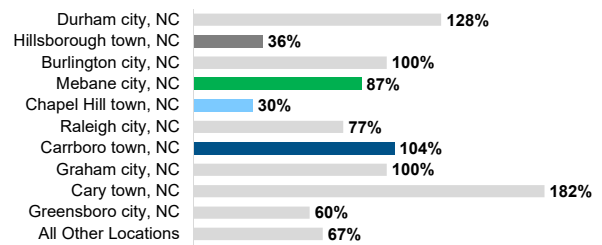

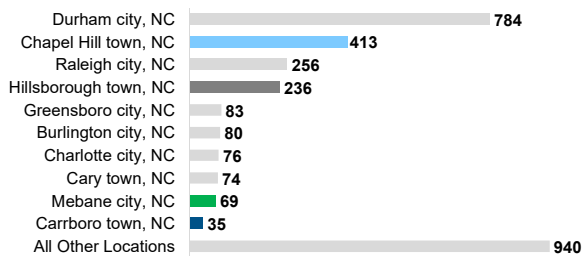

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Where do Hillsborough Residents Work? (2017)



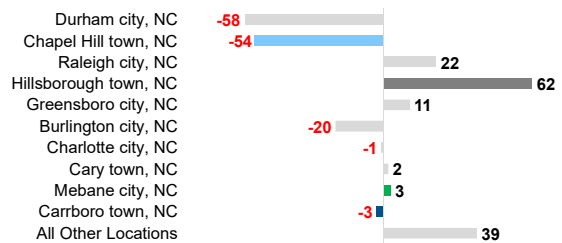

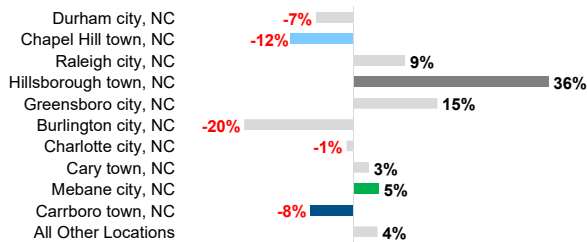

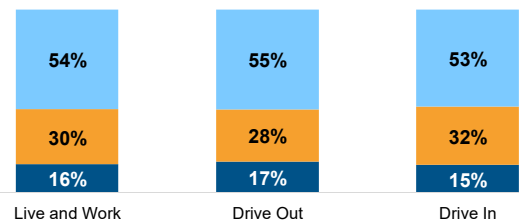

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Few Differences in Earnings by Place of Work/Residence for Orange County

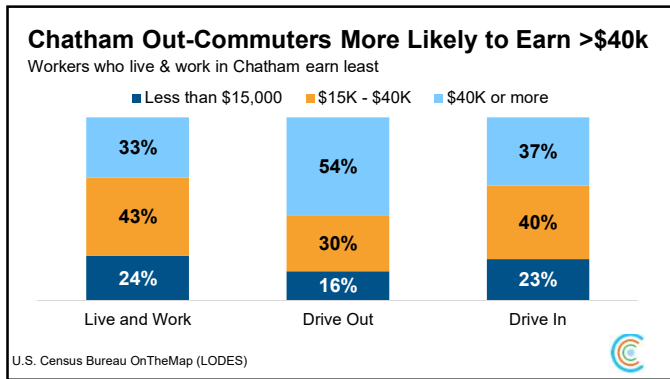

Percent increase in Orange County resident workers under 30, 2010-2017

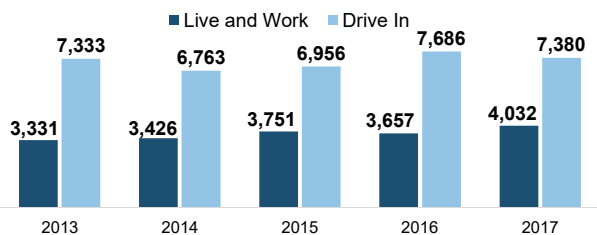

Uptick in Young Workers (Under 30) Living and Working in Orange

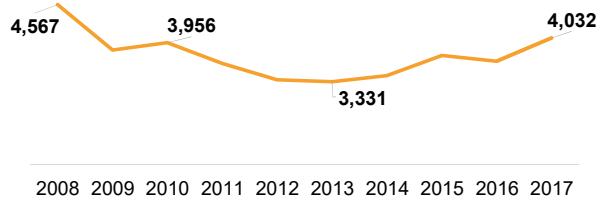

Number of Orange County Workers Under 30 Living and Working in Orange Highest Since 2009

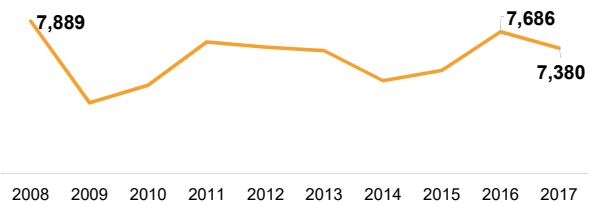

Number of Orange County Workers Under 30 Driving Out of the County for Work Declines

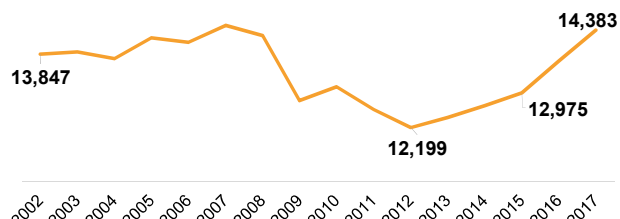

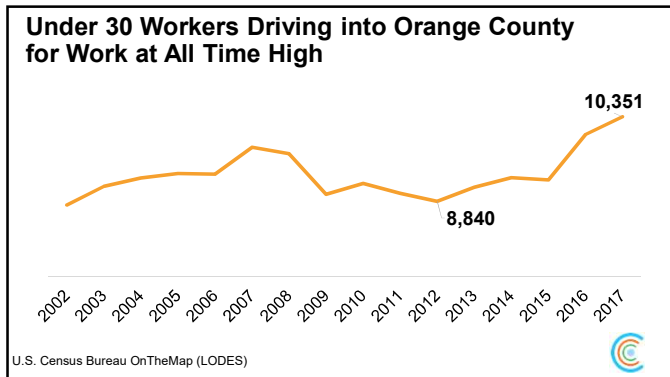
Total People Under 30 Working in Orange County Increasing From 2012 Low

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How Many Nonprofits Serve Our Community?

In 2016, the Triangle boasted 8,806 registered, 501(c) tax-exempt nonprofit organizations. Of these, 6,315 were registered 501(c)3 public charities excluding private foundations, and only 1,803 of these organizations were required to file Form 990 and 990-EZ that showed both positive organizational revenue and assets. This document will focus explicitly on those 1,803 organizations.

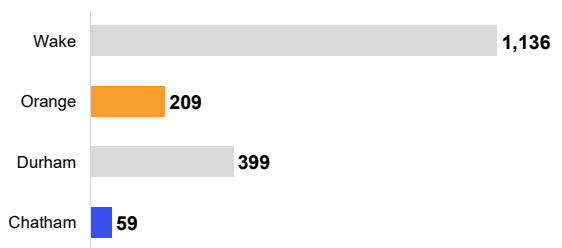

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Number of Tax Return Filing Nonprofits by County 2016

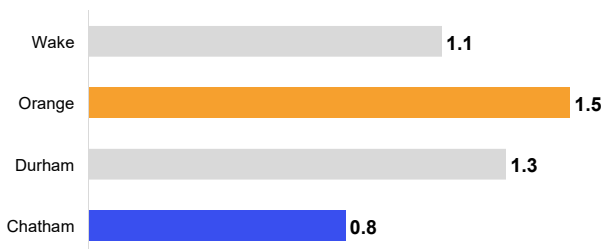

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Tax Return Filing Nonprofits Per 1,000 Residents 2016

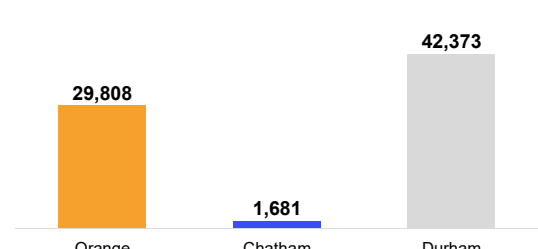

Durham Tech Licensure Pass Rates & Transfer Performance Generally Increase

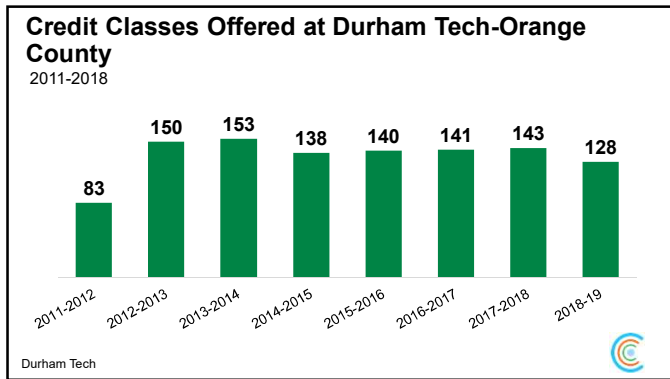

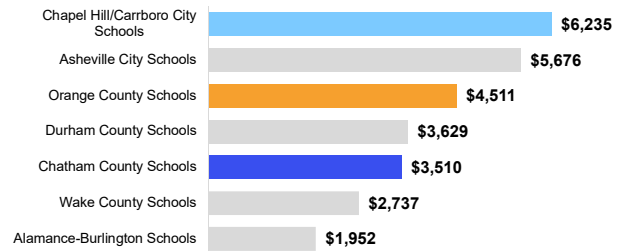
Total Per Pupil Expenditure (2017-2018)

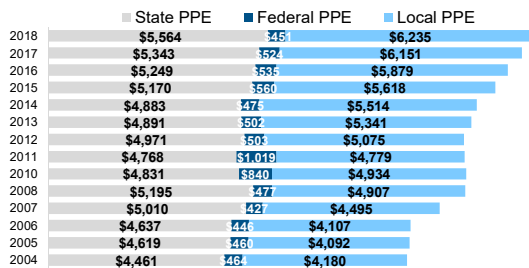
Local Per Pupil Expenditure (2017-2018)

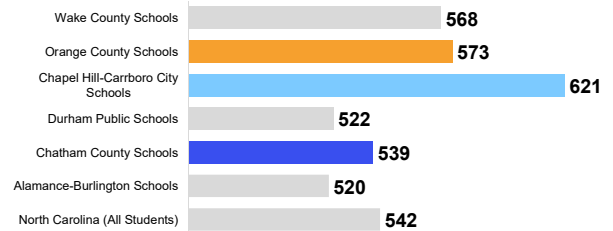
CHCCS Per Pupil Expenditure (2004-2018)

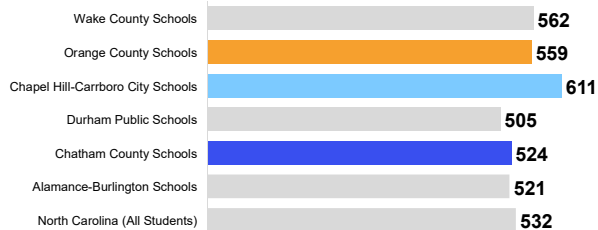
Average SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing Score (2018)

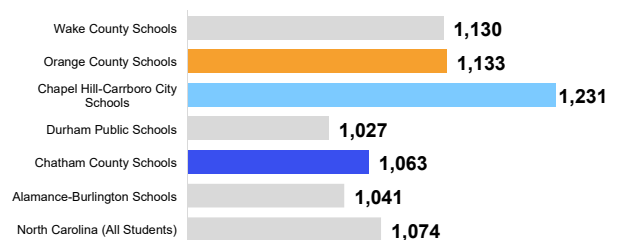
Average SAT Mathematics Score (2018)
