Higgerson School Historic Site: One-room school that operated at Higgerson Landing in 1948. The Higgerson school is a window to the educational practices that shaped and served rural America from the early 19th century. 300 S. Main, New Madrid 573-748-5716

HISTORIC HOMES

Downtown Walking/Driving Tour: Upon the draining of area swamps and cultivation of cotton, Sikeston experienced a period of great prosperity. During the 1920's Sikeston was home to more millionaires, per capita, than any city in the U.S. Many of these homes remain today and can be viewed on the Historic Homes Walking/Driving Tour. Brochures available at the Visitors Center, 116 W. Malone Avenue or online at Sikeston.net

Hunter-Dawson Home State Historic Site: This historic site preserves a now-vanished part of Missouri: the Bootheel mansion. Constructed circa 1860, the site is filled with original pieces from the home's first owners. Open week-days 8:30 AM-5 PM, Saturday 10 AM-4 PM, Sunday Noon-4 PM. 310 Dawson Rd., New Madrid, MO 573-748-5340

Mississippi County Historical Society Home: On the National Registry of Historic Places, this 1899 Victorian country home has 17 rooms filled with some of its original furnishings. HUNTING & FISHING

Sikeston is just an hour away from 13 Federal and State Parks/Conservation Areas, providing you limitless opportunities for hunting and fishing. Choose from pond, lake, stream or river fishing. NATURE TRAILS & ATTRACTIONS

VETERANS' MEMORIAL DRIVING TOUR

For military and history buffs we suggest you visit all or a portion of the sites on this itinerary. (Available online at Sikeston.net/day-trips-guide-tours and click "Itineraries") Start at the Sikeston Depot Museum, 116 W. Malone, to learn the history of Sikeston's World War II Harvey Parks Air Base which trained over 1,000 Army Air Corps pilots and mechanics. Sikeston's Veteran's Park, Campanella at Linn Street, hosts an F4 Phantom jet, M-60 battle tank, 1955 Sioux helicopter, 105mm Howitzer and other displays. The Stars & Stripes Museum & Library, Missouri Veterans Cemetery and Civil War Memorial Cemetery are located in Bloomfield, MO (less than 30 minutes west of Sikeston).
