

The Royal Credit Union (RCU) Foundation made a \$150,000 gift to the Carpenter St. Croix Valley Nature Center in support of the Center's new Wisconsin campus just outside of Hudson. Carpenter St. Croix Valley Nature Center serves 30,000 people annually, including 7,000 K-12 students. Entrance to the Nature Center is free and program fees are kept low to ensure access to all. The new Wisconsin campus will provide a place for people of all ages to connect with nature and learn from experienced Carpenter naturalists.
