New Year Offers Reflections and Renewed Commitment

Reflecting on the past three years, our community has come together to navigate a new sense of normal in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2022, we saw the return of many in-person events and member gatherings, and we look forward to carrying this energy into 2023.

At its January meeting, the Chamber Board of Directors approved the Plan of Action for 2023 based upon member feedback, surveys, and discussion at the December Planning Retreat.

The mission was reviewed and remains the same for this year: "To provide value to and serve our members, promote a strong local economy, advocate for the interests of the business community, champion sustainability, and market the recreational and cultural opportunities in the Hudson area."

The Board identified five key priorities for the year:

- Connections: Develop and coordinate events and services that positively impact members and the community.
- **Promotion:** Increase the economic benefits of tourism by marketing Hudson to both local and tourism audiences as a community to explore, visit, and support.
- Recruitment and Engagement: Develop partnerships with organizations/agencies/education system to help employers attract and retain the skilled workers they need to compete.
- Foundation: Support the community financially with a focus on advancing education and the workforce development initiative within Hudson and the surrounding area.
