

First Quarter Results Reflect Renewed Growth and Momentum

When the Chamber Board approved the 2023 Plan of Action, we committed to providing quarterly updates to the membership on the progress of the plan. I am pleased to report that as we concluded our first quarter, we are making progress on all five of our 2023 priorities. Thank you to the Board and all members for your continued involvement and support.

Membership Goal: Continue providing recognized value that results in an increase in new members and retention of existing members.

Q1 Results

- Welcomed 24 new members.
- Drive for 5 Committee (formerly Membership Committee) continues to meet to develop strategies and plan the Annual Chamber MAX event set for September 14.
- Updated the 2023 Membership Brochure and Sponsorship Opportunities.
- Presented the Hudson Downtown Development Forum in January at Pedro's del Este, which provided members with the opportunity to ask the Community Development Director and project developer questions about the upcoming proposed housing project in downtown Hudson.
- Ambassador Committee continued to foster relationships with members through monthly retention visits. They also welcomed five new members with ribbon cuttings.
- Connections & Coffee Committee (formerly Hudson Business Connections) has met in person with 85 members joining the first quarter.
- The Lucky Clover Contest had 53 participating businesses in March to encourage shopping, dining, and living locally.
- Non-Profit Roundtable held its quarterly meeting discussing new trends in communicating with donors.
- Continue to recognize members through the Brand Champion program and the Legacy Member program.

Programs and Services Goal: Develop and coordinate events that address the needs and interests of members while meeting Chamber financial objectives.

Q1 Results:

- More than 225 members attended the Annual Celebration where we paid homage to 70 years of the Chamber and recognized our award winners, board members and committee members.
- Held our first Simply Connect of 2023 in February at Pedro's del Este.
- Presented our first Good Morning Hudson program of 2023 in March in celebration of International Women's Day.
- The Leadership Hudson class of 2022-2023 has continued to meet monthly, with programs this quarter focusing on Health & Human Services, Government, and Arts & Culture/Leadership Development.

Tourism Goal: Increase the economic benefits of tourism to the community by marketing Hudson as a community to explore, visit, and support to both local and tourism audiences.

Q1 Results:

- Promoted the Annual Hudson Hot Air Affair event held in early February.
- Sent out 53 visitor information packets.
- Continued to update and enhance the website.
- Developed 2023 marketing plan.

Every year on April 22, Earth Day marks the anniversary of the pivotal date in which the modern environmental movement was born in 1970.

In the decades leading up to the first Earth Day, mainstream America remained largely oblivious to environmental concerns and how a polluted environment threatens human health. The publication of Rachel Carson's New York Times bestseller *Silent Spring* in 1962 laid the foundation for emerging environmental consciousness as it raised public awareness and concern for living organisms, the environment, and the inextricable links between pollution and public health. Eight years later, Senator Gaylord Nelson, Representative Pete McClocskey, and environmental advocate Denis Hayes organized college campus teach-ins regarding the deterioration of the environment, thus initiating the birth of a global movement.
