# St. Croix County Yellowstone Trail Heritage Day Coming August 12

Follow the fancy cars to Hudson for the Yellowstone Trail Heritage Day on Saturday, August 12. It's a St. Croix County-wide celebration of the historic highway that passed through Hudson. The Yellowstone Trail was the first transcontinental automobile highway through the northern tier of states in the early 1900s, running from Puget Sound in Washington State to Plymouth Rock in Massachusetts.

The August 12 event will offer three different car shows, a 1920's dance demonstration, history displays and tours as well as other fun activities in Hudson and other St. Croix County communities along the Trail. Car shows will feature British cars, Model A's, Model T's and unique classic and vintage vehicles. Community history displays will be open at the libraries in Hudson, Roberts, Hammond, Baldwin and Woodville. A Yellowstone Trail Sociability Drive and Poker Run gives everyone the chance to win \$100 for the best poker hand.
