Why do we have six Councilors? Because of rules in the Charter.

How are these Councilors elected and how do they represent Gresham? The Charter tell us.

What does a City Manager do, and what role does the Mayor play? Check the Charter!

What special rules can the City put in place in an emergency like a wildfire? Hey, that's in the Charter, too!

Every eight years, this Charter Review
Committee reviews the City Charter and suggests what, if anything, should be changed. This goes to our City Council for review. Then, if they agree, Gresham voters get to vote on these changes. Kind of a big deal, right?

Your ideas could make a difference and improve how our City works! Here's what you'd be signing up for:

- A temporary commitment of under one year
- Regular meetings (virtual for now).
  These will likely take place 1-2 times
  per monthin the evenings. Timing and
  frequency to be determined by the
  appointed Charter Review Committee.
