City of Pekin Now Taking Applications for Small Business Assistance Fund

The City of Pekin is now accepting applications to its Small Business Assistance Fund. The City will award up to \$1 million in small grants to assist businesses with working capital needs. Small businesses ared defined as those with 50 employees or less and less than \$1 million in annual gross revenue. Businesses with W-2 employees can receive up to \$5,000; self-employed individuals and businesses who do not have W-2 employees can receive up to \$2,000. Other restrictions apply. OSHA Guidelines on COVID-19 Incidents

From the Illinois Manufacturers Association: The U.S. Department of Labor announced that businesses will not have to consider confirmed cases of COVID-19 as recordable incidents for Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) record keeping purposes unless the case (1) Is confirmed as a COVID-19 illness; (2) Is determined to be work-related as defined by 29 CFR 1904.5; and (3) Involves one or more of the general recording criteria in 29 CFR 1904.7, such as medical treatment beyond first aid or days away from work. OSHA also noted that determining whether a worker contracted COVID-19 while performing work duties is difficult given ongoing community spread, and in light of those difficulties, OSHA is exercising its enforcement discretion in order to provide certainty to the regulated community.
