The Charlottesville Area Development Roundtable (CADRE) endeavors to build positive relationships with City and County leadership and elected officials. We offer the vast range of professional expertise of our participants in an effort to impact policies towards the greater community good. By collaborating with our public partners, we can work together to build a better Charlottesville. We hope this extends to all citizens through better and more variety in housing options and new developments that can accommodate our business community. Improved policies, more efficient processes and effective rules help all of us to thrive.

The City of Charlottesville Comprehensive Plan was the primary focus of CADRE for 2021. This document, the long range plan of our city, represents the strong desire to add more housing, and in particular, much more affordable housing in the community. Much of our membership has taken part in the public engagement for this plan, and CADRe Chair Ashley Davies is part of the Steering Committee. In addition, CADRE participated in the hiring committee for the new Director of Neighborhood Development Services, Mr. James Freas. Mr. Freas officially commenced his new role in September 2021. We warmly welcome him to Charlottesville, and we look forward to working with him for many years to come!

In 2022, CADRE will focus much of our attention on the update of the City of Charlottesville Zoning Ordinance. This substantial effort will immediately follow the adoption of the Comprehensive Plan and the ordinance is one of the primary tools used by the City to implement the plan. The Zoning Ordinance last had a major rewrite in 2003. We also look forward to resuming meetings with our membership and getting together much more often to continue our mission to create Charlottesville's next great places.

Public Policy Committee

The Public Policy Committee began 2021 with a series of presentations from business and governmental leaders. Conversations focused on improving business opportunities as we emerge from the pandemic. Speakers included public policy experts such as Neil Williamson from the Free Enterprise Forum as well as representatives from other Chamber committees, such as Minority Business Alliance Chair Quinton Harrell. We were also pleased to welcome County Executive Jeff Richardson, whose "State of the County" address served as a precursor to the Chamber's first annual "State of the Community" event in 2022.

The second half of the year led to fewer scheduled meetings, but more engagement with individuals to focus on deepening the Chamber's public policy and advocacy efforts in 2022. Chamber CEO Elizabeth Cromwell met with business and governmental leaders to develop a new approach for 2022. This new approach is built upon an intentional effort to build (or in some cases, rebuild) relationships between the public and private sector in our region. Solid relationships, shared recognition and mutual respect can be instrumental when building the case for a stronger business community.

As the primary advocate and convener for business, the Chamber is uniquely positioned to foster stronger relationships between the public and private sectors. More information will be forthcoming as we build out the 2022 public policy calendar to focus on relationship-building, shared goals and success metrics, and being a larger advocate on behalf of business.


Chamber Business
