

Get the Word Out!! The Early Learning Coalition has expanded eligibility for Subsidized Child Care

- The Early Learning Coalition of Escambia County now has the authority to serve a new category of families and children using a combination of local funding and State matching funds.
- Families can now initially earn between 150% of FPL and 85% of SMI and be eligible for services.
- Funding for the program is limited, but currently there is no wait list.
- Parents submit a basic School Readiness application, but when system advises they are over income they need to refer to note to contact Coalition for locally funded services.
- Check the table below to see who may qualify. If income is above the yellow (150% FPL) and below the green (85% SMI) qualification is likely. To apply go to <u>https://familyservices.floridaearlylearning.com/</u> or click on the OEL logo below. Note if income is less than the amount yellow probably qualify for regular SR.
- Once determined eligible services continue for a year as long as the parent(s) remain employed.
