Pensacola FL, January 29, 2020: The Northwest Florida Chapter of the League of Southeastern Credit Unions held its 15th Annual Panhandle Golf Invitational on Friday, October 4, 2019 at Tiger Point Golf Club in Gulf Breeze. The event generated over \$48,000 from the four person golf scramble, and a check was presented to [The Studer Children's Hospital at Sacred Heart](#) on January 22, 2020. Funds raised in the past have been used to purchase new incubators and other equipment needed in the NICU.
