## **Domestic Violence Awareness Month 2020**

**Pensacola, Fla. (October 5, 2020)** – Domestic violence impacts the whole family. During the Coronavirus pandemic some of the actions critical to slowing the spread of COVID-19 may contribute to an increase in violence. For instance:

- Social isolation
- Financial, emotional and physical stress
- Lack of childcare
- Loss of job or income
- Depression or anxiety
- Substance misuse
- Reduced access to mental health or substance use services and supports

The result of these actions could result in child abuse and neglect, intimate partner violence and elder abuse. If someone is experiencing domestic violence the following steps can be taken to help ensure their safety:

- Create a safety plan to outline ways for remaining safe while in the current situation, planning to leave or after leaving.
- Practice self-care as much as possible.
- Reach out for help and try to maintain social connections through phone calls, texts, emails and social media platforms.
