Pediatric gastroenterologist joins Children's Hospital, University of Florida Health

PENSACOLA, Fla. (September 1, 2020) — <u>Pediatric gastroenterologist Amber McClain, MD</u>, has joined the faculty of the University of Florida College of Medicine, which is affiliated with the Studer Family Children's Hospital at Ascension Sacred Heart. Dr. McClain will see patients in the Children's Hospital and in her new outpatient office in the Pediatric Specialist Tower, 5153 N. Ninth Ave., on the Ascension Sacred Heart Pensacola campus.

As a pediatric gastroenterologist, Dr. McClain diagnoses and treats children with conditions such as inflammatory bowel disease, chronic constipation and diarrhea, eosinophilic esophagitis, gastroesophageal reflux disease (reflux or GERD), acute or chronic abdominal pain, bleeding from the gastrointestinal tract, short bowel syndrome, pancreatic insufficiency (including cystic fibrosis) and pancreatitis, liver disease, nutritional problems (including malnutrition, failure to thrive, and obesity) and feeding disorders.

Dr. McClain is a fellowship-trained and board-certified pediatric gastroenterologist. She graduated cum laude with her bachelor's degree in biology from Queens University of Charlotte in North Carolina, where she was named Academic All-American for cross country and achieved the Carolinas-Virginia Athletic Conference Presidential Honor Roll. She received her medical degree from the Florida State University College of Medicine in Tallahassee. She completed pediatric residency training at the University of Florida at Orlando Health, and she completed a pediatric gastroenterology fellowship at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City.

Her research has been published in medical journals such as Clinical Gastroenterology and Hepatology and the Journal of Pediatric Gastroenterology and Nutrition. She is a member of the American Academy of Pediatrics and the North American Society for Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition.
