Pediatric hematologist/oncologist joins Children's Hospital, University of Florida Health

PENSACOLA, Fla. (Dec. 9, 2020) — Pediatric hematologist/oncologist <u>Pauline Balkaransingh, MD</u>, MPH, has joined the faculty of the University of Florida College of Medicine, which is affiliated with the Studer Family Children's Hospital at Ascension Sacred Heart. Dr. Balkaransingh will see patients full time in the Children's Hospital and in her new outpatient office in the Pediatric Specialist Tower, 5153 N. Ninth Ave., on the Ascension Sacred Heart Pensacola campus.

As a pediatric hematologist/oncologist, Dr. Balkaransingh diagnoses and treats children with cancers, blood diseases and bleeding disorders. Dr. Balkaransingh joins the office of pediatric hematologists/oncologists Dr. Jeffrey Schwartz, Dr. Erlyn Smith and Dr. Amanda Strobel. Dr. Balkaransingh is a fellowship-trained and board-certified pediatric hematologist/oncologist. She graduated with her medical degree from the University of the West Indies at St. Augustine in Trinidad and Tobago. She completed pediatric residency training at Jersey Shore University Medical Center in Neptune City, New Jersey, serving as chief resident, and she graduated with a master's degree in public health from Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond, Virginia. She received a pediatric hematology/oncology fellowship at Children's Hospital of Richmond in Virginia, where she served as chief fellow, followed by a fellowship in coagulation at Children's Hospital of Los Angeles.

She has served as a clinical assistant professor at Penn State College of Medicine and an attending pediatric hematologist/oncologist at Indiana Regional Medical Center and Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. Her research has been published in medical journals such as Contemporary Pediatrics, Pediatric Blood and Cancer, Journal of Pain and Symptom Management, Therapeutic Advances in Hematology and the British Journal of Radiology. She is a fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics and a member of the American Society of Hematology, the American Society of Clinical Oncology, and the American Society of Pediatric Hematology/Oncology.
