Now more than ever, it's important to have accessible, affordable internet.

To make this a reality, Cox is working to ensure eligible households can receive discounts through the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program.

This government-funded program, which is open to all eligible Americans for only a limited time, is available to provide temporary financial assistance for internet service. Eligible families may qualify to receive up to \$50 off their monthly bill based on their current internet service and equipment rental, or up to \$75 if they live in a tribal area for as long as government funds remain available. Through the program and our partnership with PCs for People, households are also eligible to receive a one-time discount of \$100 towards a laptop or desktop computer.

As the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program is open for just a limited time to all Americans – not just Cox customers – it's important to apply as soon as possible.

FCC EBB offers discounts to eligible households for a limited time; Non-transferrable; one per household. You remain responsible for monthly payment to Cox.
