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ECSD (FLA) Battle of the Books Winners' List

Escambia County School District (ECSD) hosted a virtual Battle of the Books competition this past Saturday, May 1st, for 22 schools (19 elementary and 3 middle). A total of 55 teams made of 256 students competed against each other to see who had the most knowledge of this year's Battle of the Books titles.

Participating students read up to 15 titles from the competition year's Sunshine State Young Readers book lists. There is a list for grades 3-5 and another list for grades 6-8. Teams met before, after, and during school with their coaches to discuss the books' themes, characters, settings, and main events. Questions can be about a specific detail from a specific book or they might ask students to make connections between multiple books.

Finally, on this past Saturday, they all went to school so they could compete online. They worked as teams to put all of that knowledge to the test. Each team was allowed up to five students from the same grade level (middle school teams could be a mix) against teams from the same grade level from other ECSD schools. The competition included 4 rounds of 10 questions each and then a final Lightning round to break ties as needed for first, second or third place.

This year's ECSD Battle of the Books was completely virtual. The Media Services department collaborated with Gary James, an ECSD Technology Specialist, to create ECSD's very own Battle of the Books digital platform called BookBattle.

"Students met at their schools with their coaches, sat with their teams and logged into the system on Saturday. They were presented with 4 rounds of questions, bonus questions, and tie breaking lightning rounds. Gary worked diligently to create an interactive platform that allowed students to show their knowledge. All participants were extremely pleased with the virtual program and we plan to continue to use it even when we have a traditional in-person competition next year," explained Michelle White, ECSD's Coordinator of Media Services.
