Food Security

The Florida Blue Foundation focuses its grantmaking on three Drivers of Health: Food Security, Mental Well-Being, and Health Equity. This funding opportunity is focused on Food Security.

Description of the 2021 Food Security Grant Program

Goal: Impact food security of families and communities to help mitigate associated costly issues, which can be detrimental to health, development and well-being

Target Issues

- Access to healthy food for those who live in food deserts or are food insecure
- Affordability of healthy food
- Awareness and education surrounding proper nutrition

You are applying for the 2021 Food Security Grant Program

The intent of this grant program is to award multi-year grants to nonprofit organizations that have documented expertise and experience in addressing food insecurity.

Grants are to provide support for access to affordable healthy foods for low-income families who live in food deserts and food insecure communities. Examples of eligible organizations may include community food banks, mobile food pantries, partnerships with meal delivery services, college food pantries, to name a few. The organization must have proven and effective processes and staff in place to carry out the program. In addition, the organization must provide evidence-based results as it relates to documenting their outcomes with moving food desert communities/neighborhoods/families from food insecurity to food security.

Priority will be given to organizations that have signed agreement(s) for partnerships/collaborations that are designed to expand the reach and effectiveness of the program.

Background

When completing the on-line application, please keep in mind that the Florida Blue Foundation is looking for nonprofit charitable organizations to propose proven services that will be implemented to serve primarily underserved, underinsured and low-income individuals in Florida. We are not seeking to fund research and entrepreneurial programs.

Funding

- The Florida Blue Foundation has approximately \$3,800,000 for the funding of this program.
- The Foundation will fund three to four-year grants. The approximate amount per grant is between \$90,000 to \$100,000 per year.

What We Will Support

- 1. Salaries, including benefits
- 2. Rental fees for program/meeting costs
- 3. Webinar or other types of media/technology
- 4. Program materials/equipment
- 5. Required travel related to this grant (e.g., attend Florida Blue Foundation's Annual Community Health Symposium and Sapphire Awards, any program orientations, etc.)
- 6. Training/educational materials
- 7. Printing and dissemination
- 8. Indirect costs an amount up to but not to exceed 10% of the total grant amount. (Indirect costs represent the expenses of doing business that are not readily identified with a particular grant project function or activity but are necessary for the general operation of the organization and the conduct of activities it performs).

What We Do <u>Not</u> Support

- 1. Organizations that discriminate in their provision of goods and services based on race, color, religion, national origin, disability, sex, age, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, veteran status or marital status
- 2. Organizations that do not have a 501(c)(3)
- 3. Organizations with less than a five-year track record in the field
- 4. Research and development
- 5. Individuals
- 6. Capital campaigns
- 7. New start-ups
- 8. Profit making enterprises as applicants

Completing the Application

The Program Logic Model Template and Program Logic Model Instructions are available to be downloaded. A major portion of the information requested will be populated into the Program Logic Model. Please read the Program Logic Model Instructions <u>before</u> completing the Program Logic Model Template.

The completed Program Logic Model is to be uploaded to the application as an attachment. Basic information – name of organization, program title, amount requested, etc. – will be requested within the application. Overall goal/purpose, populations served, objectives, strategic activities/services, performance indicators, outcomes/results and other details will be captured within the Program Logic Model. The information within the Program Logic Model will then be the basis for all reporting for the programs selected for funding.

- Required grantee orientation: Early February 2022

Grantee Requirements

- Please be aware that should your program be selected for funding; the Florida Blue Foundation will disburse payments via ACH transactions and you will be required to provide requested banking information.
- Successful applicants should be prepared to attend a mandatory grantee orientation that is tentatively scheduled to take place in early February 2022. Specific date, time and location will be provided once confirmed.

- Successful applicants are required to attend the Florida Blue Foundation's annual Community Health Symposium and Sapphire Awards each year for the life of the grant. Dates and locations will be provided once they are confirmed.
- When developing your budget, please include funds each year of the grant to cover the required orientation (first year) and at least one Foundation meeting (subsequent years).

Eligible Applicants

Nonprofit 501(c)(3) charitable organizations, public agencies, universities, colleges, training centers, faith-based organizations and other health related facilities that:

- 1. Are based in Florida
- 2. Have the capacity, expertise, resources, knowledge in the field and time needed to carry out the intent of the program
- 3. Have expertise in delivering educational and awareness programs on targeted topics to targeted populations described in this application
- 4. Have a five-year or longer track record in the field
- 5. Have the capability to reach target populations described under this application
