Dr. Kachur received his bachelor's degree in microbiology and his Master's degree in biology with emphasis in bioinformatics from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, Arizona. He graduated with his medical degree from Ross University School of Medicine in New Brunswick, New Jersey. Dr. Kachur completed his residency training in internal medicine at Cleveland Clinic Florida, where he was named teaching resident of the year. He served as chief resident at Ocala Regional Medical Center, where he went on to become associate program director and research director. He comes to Pensacola from a fellowship in cardiovascular diseases at Ochsner Clinic Cardiology in New Orleans, where he was named chief fellow in cardiology.

Dr. Kachur's research has been published in medical textbooks and in multiple peer-reviewed journals, and he holds a patent in a fungus-detection kit. His academic appointments include lecturer with the University of Queensland and assistant professor with the University of Central Florida, where he was named Faculty of the Year.
