The timing of the annual event commemorates the date of the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871, and killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures, and burned more than 2,000 acres of land.¹

In support of this year's theme for Fire Prevention Week² - "Fire won't wait. Plan your escape[™]" - the fire and water cleanup and restoration specialists with SERVPRO[®] in the Pensacola area remind home and business owners that the single most important thing to do when fire breaks out is to get out of the building. "The NFPA warns that today's homes burn faster than ever, leaving residents two minutes or less to safely escape a home fire after the smoke alarm sounds."

According to the NFPA, your ability to escape from a fire depends on two things: early warning from smoke alarms and advance planning.
