Chandler Mayor Update

It is an exciting time in Downtown Chandler. I thank all of the businesses and residents that patiently endured the various construction projects taking place in and around our Historic Square. This winter we will see these projects come to fruition, changing the landscape of downtown in many exciting ways. Below are a few things we can look forward to this winter.

New Square Phase I Completion – the demand for office space in downtown areas are high, with low inventory in the East Valley. Upon completion this winter, New Square will add about 60,000-square-feet of office and retail, creating ample opportunities to attract new businesses, patrons and employees. In addition, a new Hilton hotel will add more than 100 hotel rooms to the area, helping to grow tourism.

Oregon Street Parking Garage – the Oregon Street Parking Garage is now open! Located on the northwest corner of Chicago and Oregon streets, this is Downtown Chandler's largest garage, housing 932 parking spaces. With three public art installations, thanks to Chandler's 1% for the Arts ordinance, this garage will become a recognizable point of interest in our downtown. Roadwork on Chicago Street related to the garage is now complete as well.

George Oliver – Both the Ports America and First Credit Union office buildings on Arizona Place will be getting a major facelift. The development company, George Oliver, plans to invest \$14 million to modernize both buildings and will be renaming them The Alexander and The Jonathan to connect them more closely with Chandler's rich history. George Oliver hopes to begin renovations on The Alexander, formerly the First Credit Union building, in January 2020.

DC Heights – Construction preparation has begun at California and Boston Streets in preparation for DC Heights, a 157 unit multi-family complex slated to break ground in January 2020.

Senator Martha McSally Business Round Table

The Chandler Chamber of Commerce welcomed US Senator Martha McSally to a business roundtable to collaborate and listen regarding the concerns of the top businesses in the area, a great opportunity for Chandler businesses to relay their concerns to one of our Washington representatives. Issues regarding healthcare such as surprise billing and keeping small business healthcare affordable were a main point of discussion as well as cybersecurity, "robocalls", and the status of tariffs in the trade war with China. Senator McSally provid-



ed reassurance as to her positions regarding the presented concerns and placed an emphasis on continuing economic growth in Arizona as well as maintaining infrastructure for the nation, the state, and Chandler already in place.



Wrap Up—Friday, October 11th

The October 25th Policy Impact Series presentation featured educators from around the state. Arizona Superintendent of Public Education, Kathy Hoffman, spoke about her focus on dual language programs, dual enrollment opportunities, special education, and ensuring teaching practices allow for job opportunities for Arizona graduates. She shared highlights about her travels throughout the state with the strong emerging CTE (Career and Technical Education) culture amongst the districts. She also restated her concern about the immense teacher shortage in Arizona; about 20% of teaching positions are currently unfilled by highly-trained, certified educators. However, Hoffman has been proactive about attracting and retaining teachers and staff, partnering with the Department of Economic Security to fill classified positions such as bus drivers and SROs as well as working to create a mentorship program to have retired teachers guide new teachers during their first year in the profession.

Dr. Kevin Mendivil, Superintendent of Tempe Union High School District, spoke about the rebranding process the district is going through and how they are returning back to their

core values and beliefs. Dr. Mendivil emphasized the importance of diversity within the district and being able to reach and educate all types of students. As a high school-only district with a large percentage of open-enrollment students, Dr. Mendivil's concern is that every student's academic, social, and emotional needs are met and that instruction can be differentiated to allow for students to be successful.

Dr. Camille Casteel, Superintendent of Chandler Unified School District, closed out the discussion by speaking to the immense growth within Chandler. The Chandler District is continuing to expand, with having already created an independent school for Special Education and adding a high school and elementary in the next two years to accommodate the growing population. Some highlights from Dr. Casteel was their new cybersecurity program at Perry High School, which partners with the University of Arizona and Chandler-Gilbert Community College as well as recognized by the Department of Homeland Security, as well as the low teacher-to-student ratios throughout the district.

October 25th Wrap-Up

On October 25th, the Chandler Chamber welcomed US Congressman, Andy Biggs to speak with Chandler businesses and provide an update on Washington DC. Congressman Biggs emphasized his continued efforts in passing the USMCA and pushing forward bills regarding minimum wage and small business protection. Congressman Biggs also described the climate in Washington regarding the China trade war and ongoing impeachment inquiries.

Lea Márquez Peterson from the Arizona Corporation Commission spoke to the audience regarding what the Commission is doing on behalf of rate payers. Commissioner Márquez Peterson also spoke about the challenges of working with utility and water companies and helping set regulations for privately owned businesses, of which about 300 of the state's 1500 water companies are privately owned. The Commission seeks to ensure safety and reliability for water and utilities while maintaining affordability.

Sean McCarthy closed out the presentation with a comprehensive overview from the Arizona Tax Research Association. McCarthy spoke about two major topics: tax structure and collection as well as K-12 funding. He explained the challenges of taxing remote sales, concerning how and who collects taxes from out-of-state sales where there is no physical presence by the seller. Regarding the matter, McCarthy explained that there is emerging technology to help track and adjust tax rates for sales and state legislation that requires only companies making \$100,000 in profit to have Arizona taxes collected.

In regards to education, ATRA is attempting to refocus the conversation on education funding. Their concern is the equity between schools, the choices offered for Arizona education, and the achievements of our schools. McCarthy also spoke about the state's 20x2020 decision to increase teacher pay and school funding, making sure that tax payers are getting a proper return on investment.

To wrap up, Vice Mayor Terry Roe spoke on upcoming events such as Chandler 100 on Wednesday, November 6th and the AV Symposium on Thursday, November 14th, both of which are available for registration at chandlerchamber.com.

Brexit and the Road Ahead

The Chamber Public Policy team attended an exclusive event at Squire Patton Boggs on October 10 about Brexit and the Road Ahead. The UK's Brexit Counsellor at the British Embassy in D.C., Alexandra Hall Hall, spoke to Arizonan stakeholders about the impact the UK's decision to leave the European Union will have on the US economy and Arizona, in particular. The UK decided, by way of referendum, in 2016 to leave the European Union, forcing the British government to rethink its relationship with Europe and reorganize its economy. The concern about the border between Ireland and Northern Ireland was briefly discussed. A hard border could have serious economic ramifications in addition to possibly emboldening the already vocal Scottish independence movement. Negotiations have been tumultuous within the UK but Hall Hall made it clear that the UK values its close partnership with the US.

Britain is currently scheduled to depart from the EU on October 31st, unless Prime Minister Boris Johnson requests another extension. Counsellor Hall Hall alluded that the US and the UK have already established a trade agreement that largely reflects the current trade relationship with the UK as a member of the EU to limit the amount of disruption to businesses and trade at the end of the month. However, a long-term free trade agreement will have to be negotiated after the UK formally exits the EU. The British Parliament is scheduled for a special session next Saturday, October 19th to vote on Johnson's proposed Brexit deal and whether or not Britain should leave without a deal should the vote not pass. There have only been four times in British history that Parliament has called a special session to convene on a Saturday: on the eve of World War II, for the Suez Canal Crisis, for the Falklands War, and now for Brexit negotiations, signifying the importance of Britain leaving the EU.

Brexit has given the UK an opportunity to re-conceptualize their economic focus, with the possibility of emerging from this historic event with a more modernized economy. Hall Hall identifies four major economic points that the British government is attempting to address amongst negotiations with the EU and as they renegotiate trade deals with third countries: mobility, an aging economy, big data, and green growth. Among the topics discussed was Arizona's significance in US-UK trade relations. Hall Hall explained that twelve states have been identified as showing promising potential for economic growth and investment opportunities for the British government. Currently, the UK is Arizona's fourth largest consumer of exported goods and services, amassing \$2 billion in exports. With that, Arizona is positioned to be a major stakeholder in British politics as the government restructures their economy.
