

## **Propositions**



## **Proposition 207: The Smart and Safe Arizona Act**

OFFICIAL TITLE AN INITIATIVE MEASURE AMENDING SECTION 36-2817, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 36, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING CHAPTER 28.2; AMENDING TITLE 42, CHAPTER 5, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING ARTICLE 10; AMENDING TITLE 43, CHAPTER 1, ARTICLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 43-108; RELATING TO THE RESPONSIBLE ADULT USE, REGULATION AND TAXATION OF MARIJUANA.

## The Chandler Chamber of Commerce is opposed to Prop 207:

- Prop 207 would not allow employers to prohibit use of marijuana by employees outside the workplace nor take adverse action against an employee based solely on a positive test for marijuana.
- Prop 207 would create a personal "right' to use marijuana and weakens the rights of employers to maintain a drug-free workplace.
- Data from other "legal" states indicates it will become increasingly difficult for business owners to identify and develop a safe and sober workforce.
- Current law allows employers to enforce zero drug use policies in the workplace, and to take adverse action against employees who test positive for marijuana.
- Can an employer prevent a daycare worker or health care worker from using marijuana off-site and then coming to work to care for young or vulnerable individuals? Issues such as this will have to be sorted out in costly litigation battles, making it more challenging and complicated for employers to maintain safe workplaces.
- Prop 207 would reward marijuana insiders, the writers and funders of the initiate creating a monopoly that favors existing marijuana businesses.
- Prop 207 would allocate no money for K-12 Education.
- Lowers overall workplace productivity and jeopardizes workforce developments efforts.
- Prop 207 would impose a 16% marijuana tax, but cap it regardless of final cost to the state, which most states don't reach projected revenue.



## Vote NO Proposition 208: The Invest in Education Act

AMENDING TITLE 15, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING CHAPTER 10.1; AMENDING SECTION 15-1655, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 43, CHAPTER 10, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 43 - 1013; RELATING TO EDUCATION FUNDING.

#### The Chandler Chamber of Commerce is opposed to Proposition 208.

The Chandler Chamber is opposed to Proposition 208 because it is the wrong plan at the wrong time. It will have far reaching negative impacts on our economy and cause further damage to small businesses as they continue to battle the impacts of the pandemic. Passing the largest tax increase in Arizona history at our most vulnerable time is not the right strategy!

#### The Chamber wanted to highlight just a few of the many reasons Proposition 208 is the wrong Plan:

- More than 50% of those impacted by Prop 208 will be small business owners. Small businesses are the backbone of our economy and it is critical they thrive. Prop 208 would create an incredible burden on our job creators at this most vulnerable time.

# ELECTION 2020 Propositions cont.

## Proposition 208: The Invest in Education Act cont.

- Education funding advocates have long asked for sustainable revenue source. Prop 208 is not it. Having a strong economy is key to increased funding for education. It is why teachers started this year with a 20% pay raise and why, since 2015, we have been able to invest billions of new sustainable funding for K-12 education. Prop 208 uses the most volatile portion of our tax code and it will fall far short of helping teachers the way proponents claim. There are no administrative caps on spending and no guarantees for teacher pay. Prop 208 will be a shock to the economy that will result in lower revenues, not higher.
- Voters want transparency and accountability of what their taxpayer dollars are funding. Currently **only 55 cents of every dollar makes it into the classroom and Prop 208 does nothing to change this**. Prop 208 has no mandate for accountable use of money and no performance metrics. We need to make sure that students and teachers benefit, not unnecessary administrative overhead.
- Prop 208 will have profound impacts on Arizona's economy reducing competitiveness and ability to attract new business. It will result in slower job growth and reduced wages. If passed, the combined economic impact over the first 10 years alone would result in 124,000 jobs lost and a reduction of \$2.4 billion in state and local tax collection.

The Chandler Chamber of Commerce stands with Arizona's <u>small business community across all industries</u> and our students and teachers that deserve sustainable funding in opposition to Prop 208.

## **Resolution No. 5372 - Southwest Gas Franchise**



## Vote "For the Franchise"

SHALL A FRANCHISE BE GRANTED TO SOUTHWEST GAS CORPORATION FOR A TERM OF 25 YEARS TO BEGIN ON JANUARY 1, 2021 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2045 IN ACCORDANCE WITH ORDINANCE NO. 4924 SUBMITTED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHANDLER ARIZONA?

### The Chandler Chamber of Commerce is for voting "For the Franchise" on Question 1.

Southwest Gas has played a key role in Chandler's success story since 1984. Since that time, the company has worked closely with our city leaders to ensure our community has access to clean, affordable and reliable natural gas to support Chandler's explosive economic growth and to meet our residents' home-comfort needs.

## Resolution No. 5372 cont.

On the November ballot, Chandler voters will be asked to consider "Question 1." This ballot proposition seeks to renew the operating contract, known as a "franchise agreement," between the City of Chandler and Southwest Gas for an additional 25 years. Mayor Kevin Hartke and the Chandler City Council unanimously approved and referred this agreement to the ballot in May.

If Question 1 is ratified by the voters, Southwest Gas will retain non-exclusive rights to use streets, alleys and other public places to provide their essential service to current and future customers in Chandler. In addition, approval of Question 1 will:

Ensure Chandler residents and businesses have reliable access to balanced energy options, including affordable and clean natural gas, <u>without increasing natural gas rates</u>;

Establish rules and regulations that Southwest Gas will be accountable for when working within the City of Chandler;

Continue Southwest Gas' franchise fee payments to the City of Chandler to support things that matter to us like public safety, parks, and streets;

Ensure Chandler has the energy infrastructure it needs to attract and retain good paying jobs.

Southwest Gas is a proven partner for Chandler, providing access to safe, affordable, and clean natural gas while providing good jobs to our neighbors and community.



## Where and how to vote in Chandler

On Tuesday, Nov. 3, Chandler residents who are registered voters will have an opportunity to approve a franchise agreement with Southwest Gas Corporation to allow the utility to construct, maintain and operate its natural gas system in the City-owned public rights-of-way. The special franchise election will be held in conjunction with the General Election. Early voting starts Wednesday, Oct. 7 and will continue through Monday, Nov 2. Registered voters may vote early, in person at multiple locations throughout the Valley. To view a complete list of voting centers,

visit recorder.maricopa.gov/pollingplace. There are 11 locations in Chandler on this list, including:

- Islamic Center of the East Valley, 425 N. Alma School Road, opens Nov. 2;
- MVD Chandler, 50 S. Beck Ave., opens Nov. 2;
- Praise and Worship Center, 2551 N. Arizona Ave., opens Nov. 2;
- Word Life Church, 2440 E. Germann Road, opens Nov. 2;

Starting Oct. 19, voters may drop off their voted ballots at Chandler City Hall, 175 S. Arizona Ave., from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday-Friday. On Election Day, Nov. 3, voted ballots may also be dropped off at City Hall from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

To vote in person (early or on Election Day), registered voters must present identification. A list of acceptable IDs is available at chandleraz.gov/elections, under Frequently Asked Questions.

Voters have until 5 p.m. Friday, Oct. 23 to request an early ballot be mailed to their home address for the Special/General Election. To request an early ballot by mail, call 602-506-1511, or submit a request online from Maricopa County at <a href="mailto:recorder.maricopa.gov/earlyvotingballot/earlyvotingballotrequest.aspx">recorder.maricopa.gov/earlyvotingballot/earlyvotingballotrequest.aspx</a>. It is recommended to make your request as early as possible.

When requesting an early ballot, voters may request a one-time ballot by mail or have the option to sign up for the Permanent Early Voting List. Once a registered voter has signed up to be on the Permanent Early Voting List, they no longer have to request an early ballot be mailed; the ballot will automatically be mailed to the voter 27 days prior to any election.

Maricopa County Elections recommends that ballots be returned by mail no later than Tuesday, Oct. 27. However, it is advised to return your voted ballots as soon as possible. If you cannot mail your ballot back by Oct. 27, it is recommended to drop off the voted ballots at a voting location or ballot drop box.





## **Celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month**


