Budget Override Continuation Facts

What is an Override?

An override is a mechanism which allows voters in a school district to approve additional funding for operational expenses for its schools that state funding does not cover. The override election would allow the district to exceed its state-imposed budget by 15%. Since the district is requesting a continuation of the existing override in order to continue our academic programming, we do not expect a tax rate increase based on current and projected property values.

Chandler Unified School District Per Student Funding

Arizona school funding is based on this formula:

- The number of students
- The number of miles students are transported

Additionally:

- United States Census Bureau ranks Arizona 49th in the nation in per pupil funding
- When property values within the boundaries of CUSD increase from the previous year, this doesn't result in more money to the district

What CUSD's Override will do for students?

- Promote a safe and secure school environment
- Provide competitive salaries to help retain and attract highly qualified teachers and staff
 - Research confirms one of the most important factors in student success is "Quality Teachers"
 - There is a significant shortage in Arizona in classroom teachers and the override allows the district to help attract teachers
- To maintain manageable class sizes
- Continue programs in the areas of technology, STEM, physical education, athletics, fine arts such as music, art, drama, foreign language and other electives
- Help ensure academic programming remains at current level

How will your taxes be affected?

Since the district is requesting a continuation of the existing override, we do not expect a tax rate increase. The estimated first year tax rate for the override is \$1.18 per \$100 of assessed valuation, which matches the current tax rate.
