1. If elected to represent Arizona, what are your top three priorities in office?

Water security and infrastructure

Arizona's economic future is directly related to its water security and supply. In order for businesses to continue to flourish and grow, we must seek long-term solutions to address our declining water supply. As a member of the House of Representatives, I have worked across the aisle to introduce and pass meaningful legislation that will help us reach our water supply goals; for example, I introduced the Colorado River Drought Response Act which would provide \$500 million for the Department of the Interior to take immediate action to prevent Lake Mead and Lake Powell from declining to critically low levels.

Tackling inflation

Given the high levels of inflation we are facing, it is critical to work across the aisle to get real results for businesses and consumers. I was proud to vote recently on the Inflation Reduction Act which is a comprehensive package and an important first step in providing relief for Arizonans.

Supply chain resilience

In the post-COVID economy that we are living in between supply shortages and labor shortages among other causes have contributed to a significant supply chain problem. In 2022, I was proud to help pass the bipartisan Ocean Shipping Reform Act, which cracks down on unfair shipping fees charged by international ocean shipping companies that have kept American small businesses waiting for crucial supplies. I was also proud to vote on the COMPETES Act, which establishes a Supply Chain Resilience Program to work with the private sector to monitor bottlenecks and supplement private investment to address critical weaknesses. If re-elected, I am committed to working tirelessly to resolve the unique supply chain challenges we are facing here in Arizona.

2. If endorsed by the Chandler Chamber, what does your engagement plan look like with the Chamber and Arizona businesses following the election?

If re-elected I would love to continue to engage with the Chandler Chamber and support Chandler's thriving business community.
