1. If elected, what key competencies would you bring to the position?

I have served on the commission, in District 4, for the last 4 terms and am seeking my 5th term. I understand how our city government works. It takes a lot of work, and you must get to know our city leaders in all departments to understand how everything works. Prior to becoming a commissioner, I have served on several boards.
