

CATALYST PROJECTS & COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT

West Shore Community College invested over \$5 million to repurpose a vacant 14,000-square-foot building in the heart of downtown Manistee. Their vision included a community use building that housed college classes, economic, and community development organizations including the Manistee Area Chamber of Commerce.

Munson Healthcare Manistee Hospital is investing \$3.7 million in an emergency department renovation. The upgraded facilities will provide better care with equipment, privacy, and additional safety designs.

Munson also completed a 44,000-square-foot Community Health Center in 2018, at its Parkdale campus. The \$13 million helped improve the hospital's ability to deliver quality care to patients.

Lake Michigan Hotel Project - West Michigan based 6PM Hospitality and Pioneer Construction is working with the Chamber economic development team on this transformable project that will create a flagged hotel that will be a destination for tens of thousands of visitors to the area.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

In May 2021, a \$31 Million bond passed for the Manistee Area Public Schools to create secure and efficient 21st-century learning facilities supportive of our mission to provide an inclusive, high quality, diverse educational environment that inspires and fulfills the goals of all learners at every stage of their journey.
