HOMECOMING GRANT AVAILABLE:
COLLEGE GRADUATES ENCOURAGED TO APPLY



The Sioux Center Chamber is pleased to announce that they are now accepting applications for the third year of the Homecoming Grant. The Homecoming Grant is a program that awards \$6,000 to a college graduate who is originally from Sioux Center and has accepted employment in Sioux Center. Recruiting and retaining talent for local businesses continues to be a strategic priority of the Sioux Center Chamber. "Creating this grant has given us one more recruitment tool to bring talent back to Sioux Center and encourages college graduates to make Sioux Center their home," states Barb Den Herder, Executive Director of the Sioux Center Chamber.

THIS GRANT IS OPEN TO ANYONE WHO:

- has or will graduate from a two- or four-year college in 2018, 2019, or 2020
- lived in the 51250 ZIP code when they graduated from high school
- has accepted an offer for a position in Sioux Center
- has student debt more than \$6000.

The grant award is \$6000, which will be given over a 4-year period (\$1500 per year) and will be paid directly to the student's lender. Applicants must remain employed by the same employer for the 4-year period in order to receive the full grant amount. Eligible applicants can complete an application at www.siouxcenterchamber.com.

JANUARY 2020 LIBRARY ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Sioux Center Library will be closed on January 1 for the New Year's Holiday.

The Sioux Center Public Library is excited to announce a few new Teen programs coming this January to the library:

- **Maker Mondays** will be held every Monday afternoon (January 13-April 27) from 3:30-5:00pm. Teens and Tweens, 5th grade and up, who are looking for a creative outlet after school can come to the library for an unstructured time to work either together or individually on STEM topics. Registration is not required for this program.

- **Teen Tuesdays** will be held every Tuesday afternoon (January 7-April 28) from 3:30-5:00pm in Room A. There is no need to register for this event. The doors will simply be open for students to do homework, meet friends, play games, or just hang out! Once a month there will be a structured activity such as taste tests, movie days, or crafts. Stop in to check it out and enjoy a little down time after school!

- **Baking Club** will be held on January 30, February 27, and March 26 from 3:30-4:30pm. Tweens in 4th through 6th grades are invited to register! This free club will teach tweens baking basics, as well as use baking to reinforce literacy skills. Registration is required and seats are limited so sign up now!

- **Unplugged Gamers is back!** On the last Wednesday of every month, teens in grades 5-12 may come to the library after school from 2:30-4:00pm and unwind with board games. All teens are welcome and no registration is required. You can bring your own games or play one of ours!

COMMUNITY'S NEW WASTEWATER PLANT ONLINE



A new facility that will serve nearly every home and business in Sioux Center is now in operation. Sioux Center's new wastewater facility began treating wastewater in November and is now online. "It's been a long process and it is good to now see the result of that work and that long-term investment," said Sioux Center Wastewater Department Head Zeke Ellis. "This plant has new processes and better technology, and we're already seeing the benefits."

The plant was designed to meet new, more stringent DNR standards and replace the community's aging wastewater facility. It will treat the water to a higher standard and produce a cleaner effluent than the old treatment plant.

"We're already seeing levels for ammonia and total suspended solids drop," Ellis said. "The plant will also be decreasing nitrogen and phosphorous levels, and it has UV disinfection, which the old plant didn't have."

The plant's technology gives staff real time data on all parts of the treatment process, allowing

them to more closely watch the process and more efficiently keep the plant running smoothly. "As we celebrate the completion of this major project, we also want to recognize the utilities staff.

They keep standards high for service and are great stewards of our facilities," said Utility Manager Murray Hulstein.

The Sioux Center Wastewater Department serves 2,536 customers, treating an average of 1.7 million gallons of wastewater daily.
