

RE-SET YOUR WATER SOFTENER & SAVE!

Sioux Center water users can dial back their water softeners, thanks to the addition of water from the Lewis & Clark Regional Water System. **Sioux Center water is now at 22 grains of hardness.** Prior to adding Lewis & Clark water, our water's hardness was around 43 grains.

The Sioux Center Water Department recommends customers adjust their softeners down to 25 grains of hardness. Turning down water softeners can help users save on salt, water used by the softener's cycle, and wear and tear on the softener.

To adjust a softener, consult with your softener supplier, a local plumber or review the softener's manual and online information. Decreasing salt usage in softeners also will decrease the amount of chlorides in our community's wastewater, which will help respond to new DNR requirements.


