

INCOME





2023 TOP POLICY PRIORITIES

- Attainable housing financing/incentives
- Affordable quality child care
- Investment in high-speed internet
- Economic incentives that benefit northern Michigan
- Parity for hotel and short-term rental assessments
- Talent attraction, development and retention
- Sensible energy policy to keep rates low

2023 WORK

- Hosted the Northern Michigan Policy Conference in January with over 300 attendees; speakers included Lt. Governor Garlin Gilchrist, U.S. Senators Debbie Stabenow and Gary Peters, Congressman John Moolenaar, MSHDA Acting Director Gary Heidel, Acting Director of MDOT Brad Wieferich, MiHI Chief Connectivity Officer Eric Frederick, State Representatives VanderWall, Coffia, Roth, Friske, Cavitt, and Kunse, and State Senators Damoose and Hoitenga.
- Supported the appointment of Alliance-member and Lake Superior Community Partnership CEO Sarah Lucas to serve as the Deputy for Rural Development in the new Office of Rural Development; drafted and presented budget request to advocate for continued ORD support
- Achieved key wins in revising the MSHDA QAP, a document outlining criteria
 for the allocation of low-income housing tax credits; celebrated the signing of a
 package of bills to incentivize the development of attainable housing; gathered
 broad support for legislation to expand the Elliott-Larson Civil Rights Act
- Secured budget priorities such as the Going Pro Talent Fund, Michigan Reconnect expansion, Tri Share Child Care program, Housing and Community Development Program, Missing Middle Housing Program, and local initiatives for the Freshwater Research and Innovation Center, North Central Michigan College, and Northern Michigan College
- Successful efforts in having Alliance partners appointed to MSHDA, the new Michigan Statewide Housing Partnership, the new Growing Michigan Together Council: Jobs Talent and People workgroup, and the Rural Development Fund Board
- Attended important legislative events across the State such as the Mackinaw Policy Conference, UP 200, Northwest Michigan Housing Summit, and State of the State
