



ROC ENTRY FAQ SHEET

Q. Who is eligible to enter a project into the ROC Awards?

A. All current members of the HBADOC in good standing may enter. Members *may not enter* if they have outstanding membership dues or past project entry fees.

Q. Are associate members allowed to enter?

A. Yes – however, a contractor must be named on your application. The contractor is not required to be an HBA member; however, non-members will not receive recognition at our Awards ceremony.

Q. What makes a project eligible for entry?

A. Projects must have been completed on or after January 1, 2017, and be located within Durham, Orange or Chatham Counties*. Projects completed before said date or outside of our local jurisdiction will be considered on a case by case basis. Previous entries are not eligible to be re-entered.

Q. How does judging work, and are all projects required to be judged?

A. Entries are judged categorically and by price range, if applicable. All entries will be judged virtually (through submitted before and after photos and project descriptions provided on entry form).

Q. Who are the judges?

A. Judges are comprised of contractors, designers and other industry professionals from outside of our HBA territory. Judges will remain anonymous and must not have any acquaintance with entrants or entry projects. There is also a PEOPLE'S CHOICE Award, which is done through social media voting. Categories for PEOPLE'S CHOICE will be selected after all entries received, further details on this will be forthcoming.

Q. What is the benefit to entering?

A. This program is a promotion program intended to provide marketing opportunities for our remodeling members. Entries submitted by August 15 will be listed in the Parade of Homes magazine (Fall 2019), online on our website and Facebook pages, and sent out via email to the membership and interested parties. Winners will receive an award plaque to put in their offices, as well as a winner logo that can be placed on their websites.

Q. When is the Awards ceremony?

A. Tuesday, October 29 at Top of the Hill, Chapel Hill

Q. Are the homeowner forms required?

A. Yes. These forms give you permission to enter the project and gives us permission to use photos of their homes.
