
# Election Worker – How it's changed

  - Publish a notice in the Record Courier and our social media sites thanking your business




# Election Worker Qualifications

- Must be Registered to vote in the State of Nevada
- Must not be a candidate for nomination or election
- Must not be a relative of a candidate for nomination of election

# Election Worker Responsibilities

- Voter Check-In
  - Election workers use electronic poll books to locate voter records , verify voter signature and program ballot card.
    - Voters can now register at the polls and vote (same day voter registration)
    - Voters can update their voter record at the polls and vote, including changing party affiliation
  - Election workers trouble shoot electronic poll books
- Voter votes ballot
  - Election Workers assist voters with any questions on their ballot
  - Election Workers change paper, as needed, on the voter verifiable paper audit trail (VVPAT) printer
  - Election workers troubleshoot voting machine



# Election Worker Commitment and How To Sign-up

- Election Workers:
  - Temporary Douglas County Employees
  - Paid \$12.00 per hour for the election
  - Required to attend a 5 hour training class
  - Required to work election day (typically 5:30am – 8:30pm)
  - Depending on schedule and need, election workers may be asked to work shifts during early voting



# Changes for 2020 Election

- Same Day Voter Registration
  - With a valid Nevada Driver's License or ID, you can register at the polls to vote
    - Will be issued a provisional ballot
  - If you are registered Douglas County Voter, you can update your record at the polls
    - Includes changing your party
  - Anyone can request a permanent mail ballot
  - We will accept mail ballots up to 7 days after the election as long as it is postmarked on election day
  - We will be updating election results for 10 days after the election
    - To update mail ballots received after election day
    - To count provisional ballots of same day registrants that have been approved to be counted.
- Can have more than one student work at the polls



# Changes for 2020 Election

- Automatic Voter Registration
  - Everyone that uses DMV for a covered transaction (transaction relating to your identification and not vehicles) is automatically registered to vote
  - If you tell technician that do not qualify to be registered to vote, like citizenship, or if you present certain documentation, you will not be registered to vote
  - If you wish not to be registered to vote or want to declare a party, you must drop a card (that you receive at the end of your transaction) in a drop box as you leave DMV.
    - If you don't drop card in box to chose a party but you have been registered in Douglas County, we will keep your party the same of your previous registration.
  - We have seen an increase in voter applications from DMV since Automatic Voter Registration was implemented, but most are voter applications with no changes to the current voter in our system.
    - For January, we received 998 voter applications from DMV. Of the 998, 310 were new voters or about 31% were new voters.



# Election 2020 – Critical Dates

- Non-Judicial Candidate Filing – March 2<sup>nd</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup>
- Election Training (Primary)- week of May 18<sup>th</sup>
- Early Voting (Primary) – May 23<sup>rd</sup> – June 5<sup>th</sup>
- Primary – June 9<sup>th</sup>
- Election Training (General) – week of October 12<sup>th</sup>
- Early Voting (General) – October 12<sup>th</sup> – October 30<sup>th</sup>
- General – November 3<sup>rd</sup>
