Empowering people of all ages to live purposefully, creatively and sustainably through heritage crafts and traditional tools.



The Craft School at Mill Hollow Works (MHW) believes the key to a better, richer life is the knowledge and ability of how to do for oneself, working from local resources with toolsin-hand. They have taken up the task of restoring the knowledge crucial to

self-reliance and personal dignity by teaching the skills that used to be handed down from generation to generation. Courses in Tinkering, Masonry, Boatbuilding, Carpentry, Woodworking, Basketry and more, are part of a curriculum based on fostering three core values: A Sense of Self, a Sense of Place, and a Sense of Connection (to our community, region, and planet). By employing career trades people as instructors, and specializing in the use of traditional hand tools, the school brings students a diverse curriculum that combines expertly guided hands-on learning within a unique, inclusive "back yard" style Work Shop on Hurricane Road in Keene.

Mill Hollow Works was launched in 2017 by **Heather Holloway** and **Wade Smith.** Heather moved back to East Alstead in 2016, having spent 17 years in Los Angeles working in TV as a Content and Story Producer. Growing up on the outskirts of Mill Hollow, life and finances necessitated stretching the family dollar by living in a state

of self-reliance through gardening, crafting, and making. Wade is a wood boatbuilder –a trade that combines woodworking from forestry to finishing, metalworking, fabrication as well as historical research, drafting, and design. Their combined





mission, vision and strengths manifested as "Mill Hollow Works"; named for Heather's last name and region, and suggesting the artistry, industry, and capability of the 19th century New England millwright, carpenter, machinist, and farmer. Of particular significance is MHW's unique Boatbuilding Program.

Growing out of Wade's 30+ year career in commercial Boatbuilding and implementing Boatbuilding Programs across the US and Honduras, classes include Fundamentals of Traditional Boatbuilding, Wooden Boatbuilding, Stand-up Paddle Board Making, Wood Canvas Canoe Restoration and, of particular significance, Big Little Boatbuilding which pairs adult/child teams to build a small pirogue style boat called a "Jellyfish". Made of local white pine, common deck screws, and some water-based non-toxic glue, Wade specifically designed this little boat for teaching boatbuilding to kids, in a short time, and with no plywood, epoxy, fiberglass, or toxic sealants.

In addition to the learning programs in Keene, MHW also travels, creating and installing custom programs for Summer Camps, Schools, Scouts of America, Teacher Training and Team Building events. Special workshops include Team Drift Boat Building (a week-long leadership/team building program), Coracle Building, Spoon Carving, Shaker Oval Box Making, Knot Craft, Traditional Tools Workshop, Teen and Kids Boatbuilding.

Keene Housing Kids Collaborative's (KHKC) mission is to build the foundation for successful adulthood.

It is a non-profit organization working to help children living in households that are struggling to make ends meet reach their full potential. The future of our community – and any community – depends on the ability of our children to grow into productive, healthy, confident, and engaged members of our community.

Just over 500 children between the ages of birth and 18 live in Keene Housing households – with an average annual income of \$23,516. If statistics hold true for these kids, most of them will struggle to get ahead as adults, as well.

We are missing out on the contributions these young people could make if they reach their potential as fully successful adult members of our community: contributions in art, science, business, and civic life. The Kids Collaborative is working to change things for children and youth living in Keene Housing by connecting them to existing opportunities and experiences in the community that will give them the tools they need to succeed.

KHKC pays tuition and other participation fees, liaise with families to make them aware of what's happening in the community, manage applications and other paperwork, and act as a central point of contact and clearinghouse of information.

Parental involvement is a key component of the Kids Collaborative model and empowers Keene Housing parents to provide their children with the experiences and activities that children from more well-off households take for granted.

In 2019, 270 kids participated in more than 700 separate activities in the community in art, athletics, and academics. In 2020, despite the challenges of the pandemic, 216 kids from Keene Housing households participated in activities in the community through the Kids Collaborative.

If you've ever watched the television program "Turn", you know that Rogers' Rangers was a company of soldiers from the Province of New Hampshire. Raised by Major Robert Rogers, this militia was attached to the British Army during the French & Indian War period of the 1740s. The Ghost Army tells the true history of a secret U.S. Army unit of 1,100 troops that was set up in 1944 and operated until 1945 in the final stages of World War II in the fight against German troops in various parts of Europe. They used a combination of visual, sonic and radio deception to convince the enemy of the presence of specific Army units that were in fact operating elsewhere.

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
