The Committee was given the task of researching, advising, and making recommendations on establishing a Community Power Plan for the Town of Swanzey that will be considered by voters at Town Meeting in March 2022. Community Power refers to a program where a town purchases electricity on behalf of residential and business customers. One of the benefits of Community Power can be a reduction in utility costs because the town is pooling all customers together for more competitive pricing. Other benefits include more local control over where electricity is being sourced from and the ability to increase the amount of electricity coming from renewable energy sources.

The Swanzey Community Power Committee has created a survey to assess the needs and interests of the community to design its own Community Power program. GKPC Begins Project to Promote the Region



After years of planning, the Greater Keene and Peterborough Chamber is prepared to launch a new initiative to create a brand and a marketing plan for the Monadnock Region – to help bring more workers, residents,

higher education students, and visitors to the area.

Funding for the project has been provided through a grant from the U.S. Economic Development Administration and from generous local supporters. The plan calls for a budget of \$600K for the coming three years, with \$300K provided by the EDA grant and \$100K raised so far from local businesses, organizations, and municipalities.

GKPC issued a request for proposals, and from the ten agencies that responded we selected North Star Place Branding and Marketing to assist with creating the brand and marketing plan. North Star specializes in creating brands for places, and their process includes soliciting significant input from the communities they work with. It is essential that the brand resonates with those of us who live here.

Julie Schoelzel of Keene has been hired by the Chamber as Project/ Marketing Manager. Julie will start on September 13 and serve first as the liaison between the agency and the Chamber. When we move into the marketing phase of the project, Julie will lead that effort.

GKPC held public meetings in Keene and Peterborough on July 28 and 29, respectively, to present the initiative as part of its Regional Issue Series. The meetings were well attended by Chamber members, and their response was overwhelmingly enthusiastic.

While the term of the EDA grant is three years, it is GKPC's intention that the project be ongoing, funded by local contributions and additional grants we will apply for. This is an exciting new program that will benefit Chamber members and everyone who lives or works in the Monadnock Region.

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


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
