Congratulations to the 2021 GKPC Business of the Year!

Would we, the Monadnock region, be the same sustainable and resilient community without a surrounding landscape rich with productive farms? Without a thriving hub of healthy provisions in downtown Keene? Without a member-owned, growing business that provides local jobs, and educational resources? Where would be we without the Healthy Food For All program, where customers who qualify get 10% off their purchase?

Phoebe Bray — the Director of the Community Kitchen, 2020's Windsor Brooks Business of the Year recipient — is acutely aware of the role food security plays in the health of our community and especially pleased to announce that the Monadnock Food Coop is our 2021 Business of the Year.

The Coop — as the locals call it — brings true value to the food supply chain in our region. They've provided \$87,000 in support for regional farms through their Farm Fund since 2017 and additional funds through the Round Up program at the check-out. They provide the shelf space for over 350 local farmers, growers, brewers, bakers, and makers. Their city-center location adds to the vibrancy of downtown Keene for residents, visitors, and commuting workers. Since 2013, they have more than doubled their sales and in 2021, the Coop expanded its space in response to the increased demand. The new space has allowed the Coop to boost its purchasing power, thus lowering its cost to consumers, and making healthy food even more accessible. They have been able to hire an additional 30 staff members and expand the cafe space to better welcome and connect the community.

In addition to the expansion, the Coop debuted the first locally owned, community supported solar project in the Monadnock region. This locally developed, funded, owned, and controlled project is on track to pay back investors.

Congratulations to the community elected board of directors, the incredible Coop staff and management, the local suppliers, and the 3600+ member-owners at the Monadnock Food Coop. Watch the announcement video [here](#).

OSHA's COVID-19 Vaccination and Testing ETS: What are employers responsible for?

When the OSHA COVID-19 Vaccination and Testing Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) went into effect on November 5, 2021, it caused concern and confusion for many employers. Suddenly, those businesses with more than 100 employees were faced with implementing a policy that fits their organization, but most people don't have experience in this area. The questions around compliance and legality started coming immediately, as expected.

As the writing of this article, the ETS is on hold pending the court's decision on the financial burden to employers, along with other items in question, such as whether COVID-19 presents a "grave danger" to workers.

Before issuing an ETS, OSHA must determine that workers are in grave danger due to exposure to toxic substances or agents determined to be toxic, physically harmful, or new hazards. An emergency standard is needed to protect them.

OSHA suspended implementing and enforcing the ETS on November 16, 2021. However, OSHA can still cite employers under the General Duty Clause for COVID-19 hazards. Employers still have a duty to protect employees from known hazards likely to cause harm to employees. OSHA has identified COVID-19 as a workplace hazard.

There is still a possibility that the ETS will go forward, so it is crucial to be prepared. One thing to remember is that the ETS is not a hard vaccine mandate. It gives employers the option to create a policy requiring all employees to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 or to create a policy that allows workers to get tested weekly. Additionally, it addresses face coverings for unvaccinated workers, removing ill workers, maintaining records for vaccination status, employer support of vaccinations, employee communications, and incident reporting.

Typically, when we must test employees for work-related medical conditions, the cost is to the employer. In this case, the cost of testing is the employee's responsibility. OSHA hopes that vaccination would be looked at as a cost-saving to the employee, as they are free and would no longer have to pay for the cost of the testing. Employers can choose to pay for the testing, but it's important to understand the intent of the guidelines.

We now know that vaccination is the most effective way to stop the spread of COVID-19. Continuing precautions, such as distancing, remote work, masking, hand washing, and disinfection, make it much harder to spread in the workplace.
