- ✓ Good citizen at school – grades, attendance and behavior. Your school leadership must confirm your eligibility into our program, but they do not pick students for our program- our team does that.

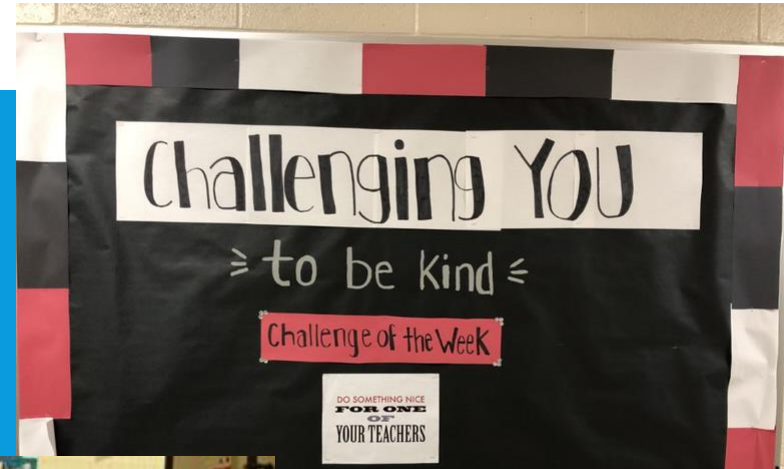

Transportation provided to/from schools to session venues (except June Retreat). Pick up times at schools vary.

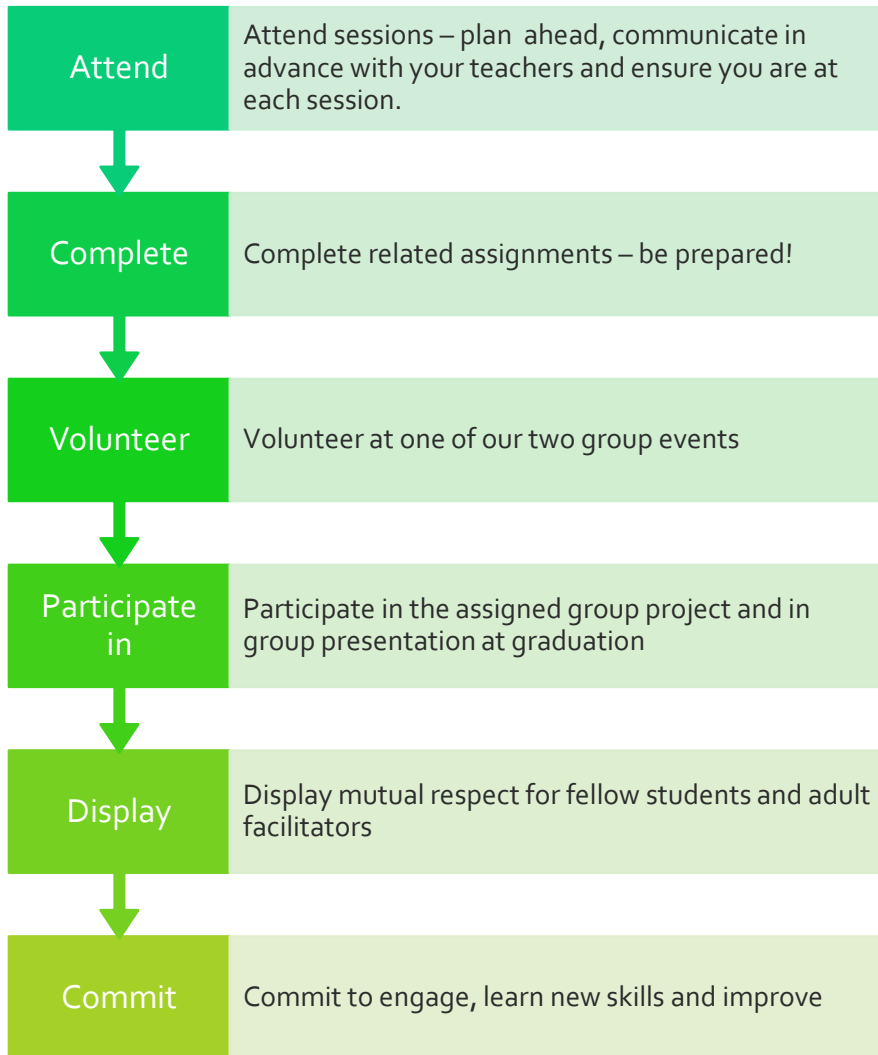
