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Taber: A History

The beginning of the community we recognize as Taber starts in the late 1890s with the settlement of homesteaders and later the arrival of Mormon settlers from the United States in 1903. They established a hamlet known as Tank #77 along the Medicine Hat-Lethbridge Railway, with the hamlet's economy based on coal mining. The Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) established a post office and changed the name to Tabor; however, the paperwork for the post office came back spelled as "Taber." When the hamlet was incorporated into the Province of Alberta on July 1, 1907, the name was officially changed to Taber.

The Town of Taber thrived on coal mining. The coal was mined in Taber and shipped to Medicine Hat on the Oldman River steamers, with it later being transported by a narrow-gauge railway. However, the coal mining industry dramatically declined in 1913 with the opening of new coal mines in the Drumheller area. This forced the smaller mines in Taber to close.

Through the 1920s, Taber's economy reinvigorated itself with the extensive irrigation development in Southern Alberta. Irrigation allowed crops to be grown in the region without fear of droughts and grew the agricultural economy to what we still see today. In 1934, a vegetable canning plant opened and was the start of the agri-food processing industry in the community. Sugar beets also became a popular crop in the Taber area, and in 1950, a sugar beet processing plant was opened. Lantic

Inc. still operates the Rogers Sugar Factory in Taber to this day. Our modern agricultural economy is deeply rooted in the perseverance and dedication of those first pioneers and farmers that saw their work forge into the modern era.

In 1937, oil was discovered in the Taber area, further diversifying the economy and allowing the community to become less reliant on agriculture as its sole economic driver. Today, both the agricultural and oil and gas industries have created a stable economy within the community.

Taber's history spans many decades, and there is still so much to discover about our origins, industries, places, and people. We encourage you to visit us and our local museum to learn more about how our history helps make Taber a great place to grow!

Investment Incentive Bylaw

The Investment Incentive Bylaw offers a municipal tax exemption on a tiered scale over five years, including a 100% exemption in the first two years. 

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Did you know that Taber has Alberta's third oldest twinning relationship with a town in Japan? It's true! Since 1981, the Town of Taber and Notogawa, Japan, have been twinned municipalities. Located within the Shiga Prefecture, Notogawa merged into the City of Higashiomi in 2006, the same year the Town of Taber re-signed the Twinning Agreement.

Notogawa Station is the only Japanese Railway Station in Higashiomi, which harkens to the similarity between the two municipalities regarding the importance of the railway.

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


In 1920, the Taber Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion resolved to erect a monument to honour the 25 local men who did not return from World War I, paying the ultimate sacrifice for their community and country. What eventually became the Taber Cenotaph was entirely the work of veterans (except for the statue), and it still stands proudly in the centre of town.

A local veteran named Thomas Love posed in uniform for a picture that was subsequently sent to Italy, where master sculptors completed what is said to be one of the most perfect replicas of a Canadian Solider in a monument. The Cenotaph was officially unveiled on July 11, 1928, and its caretaking was formally presented to the Town of Taber. It serves as a visceral reminder of those who gave everything for our community to live in peace. Since its unveiling, the Cenotaph has undergone upgrades, including the inclusion of the names of those local men who also served and died in World War II.

Today, Cenotaph Park is the site of various remembrance ceremonies throughout the year. It is with pride and honour that the Town of Taber maintains the grounds for this important part of our community's collective history.

Cornfest - August

Cornfest is the largest FREE family festival in Western Canada. Cornfest is hosted by the Taber and District Chamber of Commerce and is celebrated with music, entertainment, rides, fairgrounds, food trucks, cooking competitions, a show and shine, skateboard contest, fireworks and much more! Corn is King at Cornfest, and the famous Taber vegetable is celebrated in displays, events and (of course) in food. There's fun for the whole family!

Taber Pheasant Festival – October

Come and enjoy Canada's largest hunting festival! The Taber Pheasant Festival is a week-long hunting extravaganza with 40+ hunting sites around Town, the "Game to Gourmet" Culinary Event, novice shoots, Scotch tasting & Wing Wednesday and the Celebration Banquet and Silent Auction. The event draws hundreds of hunters from across Canada and the United States to Taber.

Demolition Derby - May

The Demolition Derby is held every year in May at the Taber Agriplex and is fun for the whole family!

Canada Day – July 1

Numerous events are held throughout the region on Canada Day, including parades, fireworks, sporting competitions/ events and more.

Taber Winter Festival – December

Every year, the Taber and District Chamber of Commerce hosts the Taber Winter Festival in partnership with the Town of Taber. This fun family experience in downtown Taber involves a visit from Santa Claus, hayrides, local entertainment, hot beverages and shopping. The Town of Taber is also well into the building of The Meadows, our brand-new attainable manufactured housing subdivision that will help facilitate and support the Town's

growth.

Located North of 64th Street on 50th Street, at full buildout, the Meadows of Taber will provide 302 lots ranging in size designed to accommodate 20 – 28 ft wide homes. The Meadows lots are fully serviced, and a gravel pad is in place for home installation. An asphalt parking pad sized for two vehicles is included. Lot layouts are large enough to accommodate a single detached garage, large deck or lawn and garden area.

It also offers the opportunity to build a slab-on-grade home. This means a home that fits the same footprint as a manufactured home can be built on-site. No more waiting for manufactured homes to arrive—get started today!

Phase 1 anticipates 91 lots of varying sizes to accommodate a range of manufactured housing styles.

Near Ken McDonald Park and Town-owned lands immediately east on 50th Street, the opportunity arose to not only develop residential areas, but to designate some of the lands for future school and recreation needs. The development is close to the Eureka Industrial Park, which makes it ideal for employees to live near employment centres. It is also nearby to parks, schools and a pathway system, allowing residents to benefit from both and provides for an excellent quality of life.

Ken McDonald Sports Complex (Taber)

Ken McDonald Sports Complex is an outdoor facility with four baseball diamonds, two soccer pitches and a soccer/football/ rugby field.

Aquafun Centre (Taber)

Location: 4700 – 50th St

The Aquafun Centre is the community's year-round indoor swimming pool which includes a lap pool, leisure pool, hot tub, steam room, sauna, waterslide, diving board, and children's play lagoon.

Vauxhall Swimming Pool (Vauxhall)

Location: 417 – 4th Ave

The Vauxhall Swimming Pool is where you can beat the heat during the hot summer! The facility includes a kid's splash area, lap pool and slide.

Confederation Park (Taber)

Location: Corner of 50th Ave and 50th St.

The central site for the famous Cornfest as well as Canada Day festivals. For the rest of the year, there are about 11 acres of land for picnics, tennis courts, two ball diamonds, a gazebo bandstand, an arts and crafts centre and the Parkside Manor Senior's Centre. Confederation Park also includes a skatepark and spray park with seasonal washroom facilities.

Community Centre (Taber)

The Community Centre is an indoor facility offering a range of recreational activities and includes space for meetings and events. It also has two ice arenas, a curling rink and an auditorium.

Taber Golf Club (Taber)



Vauxhall is a growing community and combines the benefits of small-town living with provisions of larger urban centres, and we are within easy driving distance of larger centres.


