Hein Addresses Chamber February 23rd

Tourism and agriculture are already \$500 milliona-year industries in Ulster County and they could soon be getting some help.

Ulster County Executive Mike Hein, who addresses the Chamber's next breakfast meeting on Feb. 23, believes the county could be looking at the "creation of an entirely new industry" thanks to the the state extending a film production tax credit to Ulster and surrounding counties.

Hein said he will share his thoughts on the tax credit at the breakfast, scheduled from 7:30-9 a.m. at the Best Western Plus in Kingston.

"This has the potential to open up an entirely new sector that was sealed off from us before because of the discriminatory practice that excluded Ulster and a host of other counties in the Hudson Valley from an upstate tax credit," Hein said.

Productions that film in bucolic Ulster County were already eligible for a 30-percent tax credit for certain expenses. But last year, state lawmakers

and Gov. Andrew Cuomo extended an additional 10-percent credit to Ulster and 11 other upstate counties.

"This tax credit applies not just to the filming, but the production of new media," Hein said. "The production work creates a significant amount of high-quality local jobs."

Hein said he also will discuss many of the themes from his annual State of the County address, which is a few days before the breakfast. One of those topics is a major success of his administration—controlling property taxes.

"We're going to talk about property taxes and really the critical importance of focusing on property tax reductions, not just property tax caps," Hein said.

"The real hardcore measure is the tax levy. The tax levy in Ulster County today is actually less than

Gateway Community Industries - Celebrating Our 60th Anniversary!

In 1957, the Board of Directors of Gateway Industries was founded under the temporary leadership of Joseph Kelly. William Edelmuth, former Mayor of Kingston, became the first President of the Board. Milton Goldstein was the first professional Executive Director named in 1963. The operation moved to Field Court and then to Hoffman Street in 1971 where it



was housed for over 20 years.

By the 70's, Gateway was offering a wide array of professional services including psychological services, vocational assessment,

vocational counseling, social services, job placement, and the sheltered work shop environment for those individuals who were not ready to be placed in community employment.

In 1990, with the guidance of Dr. Albert Gruner and the support of Kathy Cornelske, a Capital Campaign was started to provide funds for a new facility. In May of 1993, the Joe Cornelske Center opened its doors on Route 32 in Kingston at One Amy Kay Parkway. The facility was named after past board member Joseph Cornelske who had overcome his own disabilities.

Since our 50th Anniversary in 2007 the world of serving individuals with disabilities has been in a state of constant change. Funding cuts, a shifting

of reimbursement to Medicaid and determining how best to serve individuals has been at the forefront of the challenges.

In 2015 Gateway was able to expand its services to serve the seniors of Ulster County when it successfully won the bid to provide home delivered and congregate site meals.

Meet The New GM on February 22nd



the very first budget I wrote as county executive all the way back in 2010."

Indeed, the property tax levy, or the amount raised from property owners, was \$77 million in 2010. The property tax levy to support the recently adopted 2017 budget is \$76.9 million and the levy has been reduced five years in a row.

"It's remarkable and I don't think there's another county in the state of New York that can say that," Hein said.

While the sale of the county nursing home took a huge financial burden off the county and has helped with the property tax reductions, Hein pointed to other initiatives of his administration, including merging departments and streamlining operations in the Department of Public Works.

Hein said other counties have tried to replicate the changes Ulster has made.

"If people are not trying to be like you, you're not very successful," he said. "It's really been a rethinking of everything. What you have seen is a reinvention of how government services get delivered.

"A lot of the actions that we have taken have been designed to be able to deliver real systemic change."

Hein said he also plans to discuss economic development initiatives with the Chamber, including the opportunities for local businesses through Cuomo's regional economic development councils.

The county executive touted Ulster's unemployment rate, which was 7.9 percent in 2009, but has fallen to 4.1 percent today.

Hein said that number could drop further after Ulster recently received \$9.3 million in state economic development funding.

"The Hudson Valley was the big winner and we were the big winner within the Hudson Valley," Hein said. "Over \$5.5 million of that went to Kingston-based projects. I'm proud of the work my team did to be able to secure those dollars and bring them into our community."

Hein said he also plans to discuss Ulster County's recent profile in National Geographic and what it means for local tourism. "They chose Ulster County because we have a proven track record of being able to deliver environmental initiatives that are meaningful, while simultaneously protecting the taxpayers," he said. "It's really hard to put a price tag on the value of what that means to a community."

Hein said he has no regrets about not running for Congress in 2016. He had the support to all the Democratic Party chairs in the 19th Congressional District, but opted to stay put.

The open seat created by the retirement of U.S. Rep. Chris Gibson went to Republican John Faso.

"There were preliminary polls that were very positive," Hein said. "All those things are very nice and in many ways very flattering, but there is a reality, and that is I love what I do. I love being able to work on making a difference for the citizens of this community and the ability to be able to make meaningful change is what it's all about to me.

"I believe remaining the county executive was the best opportunity for me to be able to make meaningful change. It was a very personal decision for me."
