



Federal News

- You may have heard that Congress isn't operating like a well-oiled machine. One consequence is that they struggled to pass <u>legislation to fund the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT)</u> before the January 19 deadline to avoid a shutdown. At the last minute, the Democratic majority leadership in the Senate and Republican majority leadership in the House reached <u>a funding deal</u> that prevents a shutdown of DOT and other federal agencies through March 1 and March 8, respectively.
- ASA is monitoring several bills that would either <u>eliminate the Federal Insurance Office</u> (FIO) or <u>undermine its potential to protect repairers from unfair insurance practices</u>. ASA was an original supporter and played an integral role in securing FIO's creation in the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010. ASA doesn't expect these bills to gain much traction, but we're keeping an eye on them just in case.
- The U.S. House Energy & Commerce Committee has refrained so far from advancing the named <u>REPAIR Act (H.R. 906)</u> out of the committee. ASA has shared with congressional offices its <u>concerns</u> <u>with the bill</u> and has asked Congress to allow <u>the agreement</u> ASA reached with OEMs to function without government interference.

State News

- Many state legislatures have just returned to session and they haven't skipped a beat with bills introduced that would impact automotive repair shops.
- A bill was filed in Washington state that would grant auto insurance policy holders and issuers the
 right to an appraisal if the parties don't agree on the loss value on a damaged vehicle. <u>Click here to
