Cost is \$275 per person. Two Scholarships in the amount of \$100 each may be available.



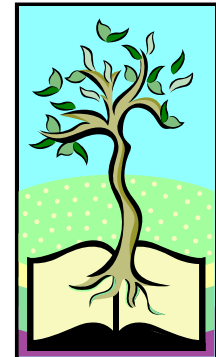

What is Leadership Sun Prairie?

Leadership Sun Prairie was developed by the Sun Prairie Chamber of Commerce, the City of Sun Prairie, and the Sun Prairie Area School District in response to the need for formal leadership development on a community-wide basis.

Through a series of monthly training sessions, this program will emphasize leadership concepts and community needs. Programs will focus on Sun Prairie's local economy, business and industry, government and education, communications and media, health and wellness, and volunteerism.

Each session will feature local leaders and specialists in various forums, including lectures, round table discussions, and tours throughout the community.

This program requires a commitment of one full day each month from September to April (excluding December), with a graduation ceremony in May.

Objectives

- To provide a program for existing and emerging leaders that develops an awareness and understanding of the resources, processes, programs and issues that affect the Sun Prairie area.
- To develop a support system among participants which will aid them in their leadership efforts as well as benefit the community.
- To increase and broaden the participants' understanding of the economic, political, and social systems within the Sun Prairie area.
- To promote involvement and participation of the individuals enrolled in the program in volunteer, elective, and appointed positions.



- To increase the participants' analytical and decision-making abilities for the betterment of the Sun Prairie Community.
