Region 4 – A Large, Unique Part of America

Some of the positives...

- **Eight States** MS, AL, GA, NC, SC, KY, TN, FL (represented by Metro4-SESARM)
- **67 million people** (20% of the U.S. population)
- 6 Federally Recognized Tribes
- Rich, diverse landscape from coral reefs to mountains
- 14 Class I areas
- Important to U.S. economy
 - Large, diverse manufacturing, forestry, and agricultural sectors
 - 1/3 of U.S. vehicle miles traveled
 - 55 marine and inland ports (handling ~25% of U.S. imports/exports)










Region 4 – A Large, Unique Part of America

Some of the challenges...

- 29% of U.S. toxic air pollution releases (2019 TRI)
- Large minority and poor populations resulting in numerous EJ concerns
 - R4 is part of the traditional "poverty belt"
- Highly prone to natural disasters hurricanes/storms, floods, tornados, sea level rise
 - 168 billion-plus dollar events in the SE Climate Region, costing \$442B (1980-present)
- Energy/Climate
 - Large contributor to U.S. GHG Emissions
 - 18.4% of the US total energy-related CO2 emissions






