Underpaid

Women Are Paid 67 Cents for Every Dollar a Man Makes



Underutilized

Only 52% of Working Women Participate in the Economy, vs 63% of Men



Lack Childcare

Alabama has a 40% Supply Gap in Affordable, Quality Childcare



High Maternal Deaths

AL has 3rd highest maternal mortality rate in the US.
