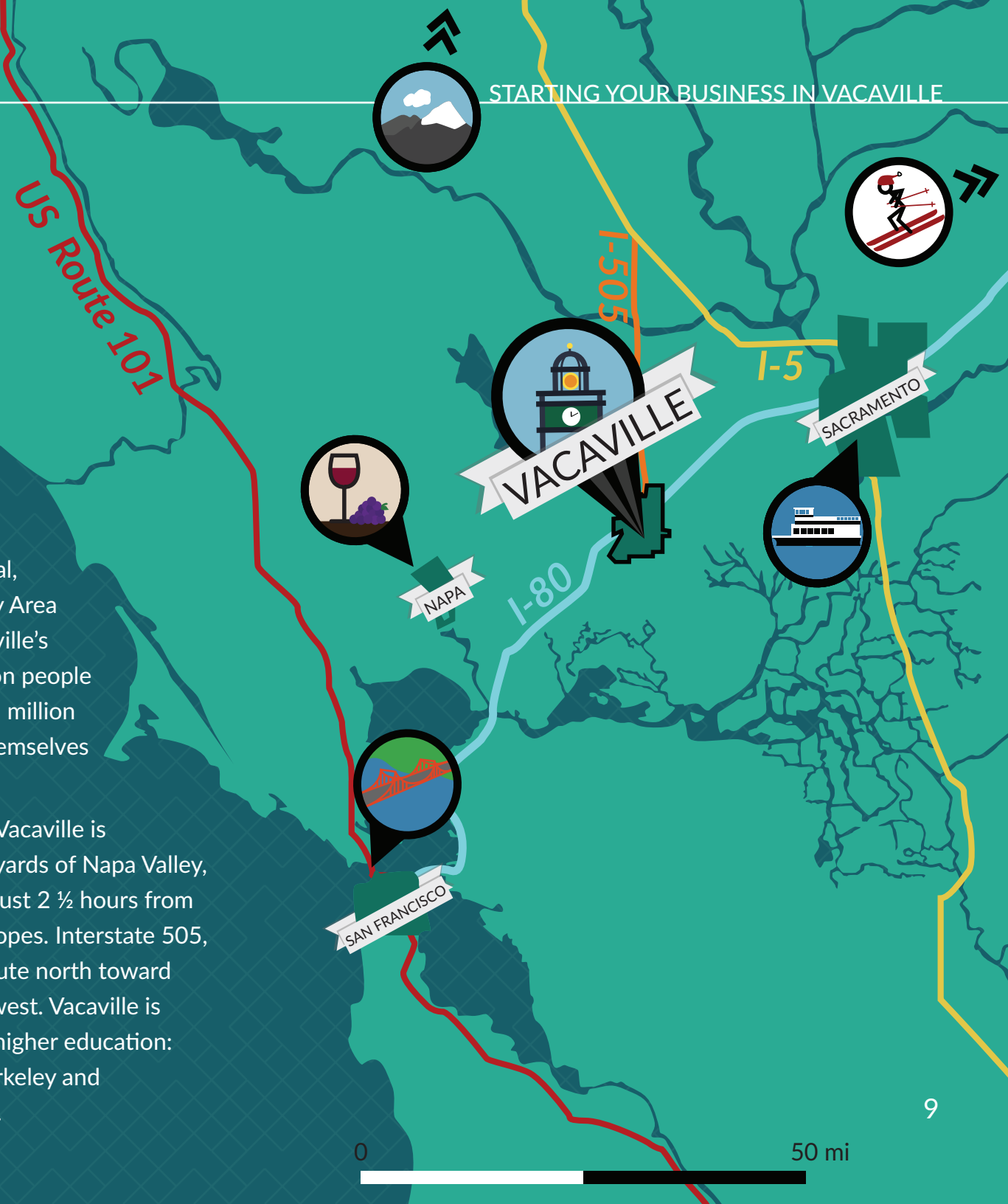
You can feel Vacaville's unique charm everywhere you go—it's in the people that make up this wonderful town. And as appealing a place it is to live, it's an equally appealing destination to start up or relocate a business. As you are about to discover, Vacaville's desirable location and its availability of retail, office and industrial space make it among the most eligible Northern California cities to do business.



OUR LOCATION

JUST AN HOUR'S DRIVE from San Francisco and a 40-minute trip from our state's capital, Vacaville is the home base of countless Bay Area and Sacramento workers. Because of Vacaville's location on the I-80 corridor, over 75 million people travel through our City each year—that's 75 million people who need to shop, eat, and avail themselves of services being offered here.

Sitting in the heart of Northern California, Vacaville is a convenient half-hour drive from the vineyards of Napa Valley, 45 minutes from the nearest beaches and just 2 ½ hours from Reno, Lake Tahoe and the Sierra Nevada slopes. Interstate 505, which begins in Vacaville, offers a direct route north toward Redding, Mt. Shasta and the Pacific Northwest. Vacaville is also within a short commute of top-notch higher education: UC Davis is just 15 miles away, and UC Berkeley and Sacramento State are each within 45 miles.



SMALL TOWN, BIG BUSINESS

VACAVILLE'S HISTORIC DOWNTOWN, safe neighborhoods and strong sense of community contribute to a small-town atmosphere that residents love, while its rapidly growing industrial park and nationally-famous retail sector make it an enviable location to start or expand a business. Vacaville is also more affordable than both the Bay Area and the Sacramento Valley when it comes to settling down or setting up shop.

The Vacaville Premium Outlets and the Nut Tree Shopping Center are the City's famous retail destinations, each day bringing visitors from around the state, around the country and around the world.

Major pharmaceutical companies Genentech and Alza Corporation each operate large-scale manufacturing facilities in the north of Vacaville, each providing of jobs to City residents. ICON Aircraft, developer of high-end consumer sport planes, manufactures its vehicles in its new Vacaville headquarters. Numerous new housing developments facilitate the continued expansion of employment opportunities in the City—for as fast as Vacaville's business sector is growing, there remains ample development-ready space available for purchase or lease.



1 STEP 1: Make a Business Plan

A BUSINESS PLAN is the first step to starting a successful business. This plan will help you evaluate your idea, estimate costs, and determine the strengths and weaknesses of your proposal. A business plan is usually required to apply for a commercial loan and it will establish a road map to your business future.

HELPFUL HINT: GET HELP!

SBDC offers seminars and free one-on-one counseling on all aspects of small business management, including business plans, accounting systems, and financing.

At SCORE, retired business professionals volunteer to provide free counseling to individuals starting small businesses.

The **Vacaville Chamber of Commerce Consultation Program** provides 15 minutes of free consultation from Chamber members on a variety of topics ranging from business law to finance.

STEP 2: Choose a Structure

IT IS IMPORTANT to determine the structure of your business for operating and business reporting purposes. Will you operate your business as a sole proprietor, partnership, limited liability company (LLC), or corporation? Each business structure has certain advantages and disadvantages in terms of costs, taxation, and liability. With respect to formation, each structure has different requirements.

If you are starting a limited liability company or corporation, you will want to contact the California Secretary of State's Office. Online, you will find additional information and forms needed for formation. You may also want to consult an attorney or tax accountant for more guidance.

Sole Proprietorship: No formation document is required to be filed with the California Secretary of State. A fictitious business name statement may be required to be filed in Solano County.

Partnership: No formation document is required to be filed with the California Secretary of State. A fictitious business name statement is required to be filed in Solano County.

Limited Liability Company: Articles of Organization must be filed with the California Secretary of State. No fictitious business name statement is required unless the LLC does business under a different name.

Corporation: Articles of Incorporation must be filed with the California Secretary of State. No fictitious business name statement is required unless the Corporation does business under a different name.

STEP 3: Zoning and Building Resources

BEFORE SIGNING a building/property lease or purchase agreement, contact the City of Vacaville's Community Development Department to determine the zoning of the site. If Community Development determines the use is allowed, then check with the Building Division at (707) 449-5152 to see if a Certificate of Occupancy is required. Also, you will want to ask Community Development staff about any sewer impacts fees that may be required for your space. If you are planning to remove flooring or tear down walls or ceilings you need to contact the Yolo Solano Air Quality District at (530) 757-3650 to see what they require.

Not all spaces are suitable for certain types of business uses. City zoning and building codes exist to protect you and your neighbors from incompatible uses. For example, it may not be safe for a childcare center to be located next door to a chemical manufacturing plant, and zoning and building code restrictions help avoid this potential hazard. Community Development staff will also inform you of any reviews, permits, or fees that may be necessary for your proposed location. Certain kinds of businesses may require a use permit and a public hearing in order to comply with the City's zoning regulations. All permit fees are separate and in addition to the business license fee.

BEFORE SIGNING A LEASE:
CHECK AND CLEAR ZONING
AND BUILDING REGULATIONS!

Zoned for what you want to do? New businesses need to check zoning at the Permit Center, open Monday through Friday at City Hall, 650 Merchant St. before filling out a business license form, purchasing property or signing lease agreements.

Want to modify the space before opening your business? The Building Division has a program that allows for a one stop/same day Tenant Improvement or Alteration Permit issuance. For most businesses, every Tuesday from 10 a.m.-noon and 2-3:30 p.m. at the Building Division Counter at 650 Merchant St., you or your contractor can obtain a permit for your proposed work. If you don't come in on Tuesday, the normal processing time is a minimum of 30 days.

STEP 4: Naming Your Business

IF YOU CREATE A NAME for your business that is different than your/its legal name, you need to register the Fictitious Business Name with Solano County Clerk's Office. This step needs to be completed before obtaining a business license from the City of Vacaville. Also, public notices announcing your new business name must be posted for four weeks in the local newspaper to complete the registration process.

HELPFUL HINT: DECIDING YOUR NEW BUSINESS NAME

To make sure your fictitious business name doesn't conflict with other businesses, you can see if it is already in use within Solano County by checking the Fictitious Business Name Database at http://www.solanocounty.com/depts/tccc/county_clerk/fbn/searchficname.asp.

To make sure your corporate or limited liability name is available, you may contact the Secretary of State's office to determine if it is already in use. If it is not, you may reserve the name for a period of 60 days.

STEP 5: Taxes

ALL BUSINESSES ARE REQUIRED to file both state and federal tax returns. All small businesses need a Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN), even if they do not have employees. A TIN is an identification number used by the Internal Revenue Service in the administration of tax laws. It is issued either by the Social Security Administration or the IRS. Taxpayer Identification Numbers include Social Security Numbers and Employer Identification Numbers. Contact the California Franchise Tax Board and the Internal Revenue Service to learn more about specific requirements.

Whether self-employed or an employer with one or more employees, you must also pay Social Security taxes.

Will you sell a product? The California Board of Equalization will help you determine whether you need a Seller's Permit; you may also be required to collect sales tax. To do so, the Board of Equalization will issue a resale number in order to report the sales tax.

STEP 6: City Licenses

ALL INDIVIDUALS, partnerships, corporations and sole proprietors conducting business in the City of Vacaville are required to have a business license. This includes persons dealing with residential and commercial real estate rentals or who operate home-based businesses within the City.

Licenses expire on April 30. Fees for new licenses are prorated from June to April. In the middle of March each year, renewal notices are sent out to all existing license holders to inform them that the annual renewal period has begun, to request updated information, and payment of fees by April 30 of the renewal year.

Closing a business? Remember, if you are closing a business in Vacaville, let the City business license staff know. Failure to notify could result in additional fees, interest, and penalties being assessed against your account.

Working from Home? If you are working from home or in an area zoned residential, you will need a Home Occupation Permit.

STEP 7: Permits and Inspections



NEED FORMS?

Most of the forms listed on pages 24-27 are downloadable from the City's Department of Finance website or from the Community Development Department.

YOUR BUSINESS MAY REQUIRE site inspections by the Fire and/or Building Department as part of your application approval, depending on your business type and/or if you are making improvements to a building. Permit fees may vary depending on the size and location of the project. The permit technicians at the City's Building Division will be happy to meet with you to discuss your project and provide you with a fee estimate.

Building Permits: Building Permits are how the City of Vacaville ensures construction is safe for occupancy and use. A Building Permit is needed for all new construction in Vacaville.

Certificate of Occupancy: A certificate of occupancy is required for all new businesses in Vacaville. This is required even if no construction is taking place. Your business must be located in a building constructed appropriately for your use. A permit is also required for most modifications, replacement construction, additions, or remodeling. Any changes to a building must comply with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

Sign Permits: If your business would like to display a sign that is visible from outside a building, a sign permit is required. The Planning Division will perform a “Design Review” assuring your sign is code compliant. The Building Division will issue a permit for its installation to assure it is safely attached to your building.

Fire Code Permits: A Fire Code Permit from the Fire Prevention Services Division is required if you want to conduct specific activities and practices. Use of hazardous substances or materials may require additional review and/or permits.

Encroachment Permits: An encroachment permit is required for any use of the public sidewalk or right of way, such as sidewalk seating or merchandise displays.

STEP 8: Other Licenses and Permits

DEPENDING ON THE NATURE of your business, you may be required to obtain one or more of the following licenses or permits:

Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) License

No person may directly or indirectly, on any pretense, sell, barter, charge for possession or otherwise dispose of alcoholic beverages as part of a commercial transaction without having obtained the proper license or permit.

California Department of Consumer Affairs License

Many professional businesses such as accountants, engineers, doctors, and dentists require a State License from the California Department of Consumer Affairs. Businesses such as cosmetology, security services, and auto repairs are also required to obtain a State license.

Import/Export Permit

If your business will involve the import or export of products with other countries, you may need to obtain an Import/Export Permit from the United States Customs Service.

Restaurants and Food Vendors and Salons and Tattoo Parlors

A health inspection is required for restaurants and food vendors, as well as salons and tattoo parlors. Contact the Solano County Environmental Health Department to arrange for an inspection, or to request information advice regarding health and environmental safety issues.

Retail and Wholesale Business Permits

If your business will involve sales, you will need to obtain a Seller's Permit from the State Board of Equalization.

Child Care Center or Family Care Home License

Licensing of all child care centers and family child care homes in California is required and can be obtained through the California Department of Social Services.

Contractor's License

Construction is one of the largest industries in California's diverse economy. The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) receive and processes applications for new licenses, additional classifications, changes of license records, and license renewals. An Application for Original Contractor's License can be obtained from any CSLB office, by telephone, or online.

STEP 9: If You Have Employees

IF YOU HIRE EMPLOYEES, be sure to register with the California Employment Development Department. They will provide you with the necessary forms and answer any questions you may have regarding your responsibilities.

As an employer, the state requires you to:

- Withhold state income tax
- Withhold state disability insurance
- Pay unemployment tax
- Pay for any unemployment training costs

You must also register with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) in order to receive an Employer Identification Number. The IRS offers many services to new business owners and will provide helpful information explaining the types of forms used and due dates for these forms. As an employer, you are required to carry workers compensation insurance. You may obtain this insurance through your own insurance agent or the State Compensation Insurance Fund of California (SCIF). SCIF is a non-profit, public enterprise fund that operates like a mutual insurance carrier.
