## This November is a first

It's hard to believe summer is over, but the signs are all there. Flashing lights on my drive to work to remind me that school's in session, the red-tinged leaves on the maple trees, the red, white and blue yard signs for local elections. Wait, what? That last one has never been an indication of the end of summer, but with the passage of legislation in 2015, local nonpartisan elections in Kansas were moved to fall in odd-numbered years beginning in 2017.

For many of you, this is old news and you wonder why I devote space to the subject. Because it was a new schedule and the height of summer, the primary caught some unaware. With a 9.92% voter turnout, there's room for improvement in November. Regardless of time of year, local elections historically experience low turnout, even though these elections impact your daily life the most, determining the level of your quality of life, development in your region and your level of taxation.

Make sure your family, friends and colleagues are aware of the following deadlines:

October 17 - Last day to register to vote

October 18 - Advance voting by mail begins

October 30 - Advance voting in person begins

October 31 - Last day to request an advance ballot by mail

November 6 – Advance voting in person closes at noon

November 7 - Fall General Election

There are a number of contested races impacting Overland Park including Overland Park Mayor and City Council races, Johnson County Community College Trustees, and Shawnee Mission School Board. Depending on where you live, you may have races for your local municipality or school board. We encourage you to utilize www. votejoco.com where we've posted relevant voting deadlines, voting information, candidate profiles, meet-the-candidate and forum opportunities and will post videos of forums and interviews post-events. The chambers comprising the Johnson County Public Policy Council will soon announce dates for these events and we encourage you to attend or watch later on-line to learn about the candidates.

It's been beautiful weather this summer for candidates to walk neighborhoods to meet their constituents. I am proud of each candidate who answers the call to public service by placing their name on the ballot, campaigning and serving if elected. It's always nice when we have an opportunity to meet a candidate face-to-face, whether it's at the door or at a forum. Unfortunately, many voters don't have that chance, and I shudder that some may rely upon push cards or mailers (or even yard signs) as a determinant when casting their valuable vote. How a candidate chooses to present him or herself on a card is just one piece of the puzzle; we should do more research to determine if a candidate aligns with our key issues before awarding our vote.

I mentioned last month that Overland Park is at a crossroads as we begin our visioning process to plan for the next 20-30 years. This crossroads is not solely about the planning process we're beginning where we dream about what kind of city we leave for the generations to come. It begins with the ballots we cast in a few weeks and who we choose to represent us at City Hall, at our school districts, ICCC, and the Water Board. This above all sets the strategic direction for our region.

First, make sure you know who is running and how they feel about the issues you care about. Is it infrastructure? Job creation? Talent and workforce development? Taxes? Check out www.votejoco.com for their candidate survey and a forum. Then, mark your calendar, and **VOTE!**



# Chamber chairmen helped lead city growth in the 1990s

In the 1990s, Overland Park was embarking on major projects including construction of the **Sprint** Campus and the **Overland Park Convention Center**. The Chamber's chairmen were helping lead the way to ensure their successful completion.

**1990** – Lynn Mitchelson was the President & CEO of Bank IV Corporate Woods. His

time as chairman coincided with the start of several major developments in the city. In

addition to the dedication of Molamphy Park, which honored the Chamber's first President, Dick Molamphy, Lynn helped break ground on the University of Kansas Edwards Campus and led the Chamber in endorsing a 50% tax abatement for the Sprint Campus. A one-time Johnson County Community College Trusteee, Lynn was named "Johnson Countian of the Year" in 2013. Today he serves as chairman and CEO of American Bank in his hometown of Baxter Springs.

1991 – The chairmanship of George Lund, Lund and

Associates, saw a transformation in downtown Overland Park. He helped form a downtown group that

worked to fill vacancies and also established the Farmer's Market and constructed the iconic clock tower. It also was during this time that an agreement was announced for the Sprint Campus. George has been retired since 2008.

1992 – David Westbrook, owner and CEO of Corporate

Communications Group, Inc. was chairman the year the Chamber celebrated its 25th anniversary. He helped

department (now Public Policy and Advocacy) to strengthen the Chamber's influence in Topeka. He also advocated for the Chamber to endorse a multi-million bond issue for **Blue Valley Public Schools**. Bill supported the City's decision to give further tax abatements for the Sprint campus. He has been retired since 2000.

1994 – Jay Williams was CEO at Overland Park Regional

Medical Center. With incentive packaging finished, the City was moving along with development of the Sprint

Campus. The City also began construction on the W. Jack Sanders Justice Center. Jay is now retired in Texas, where he is "working for my grand-children."

business retention program. He also was involved in strengthening the Chamber's Economic Develop-
