What's New at Spectrum Health Zeeland Community Hospital?

Beginning this week, Spectrum Health Zeeland Community Hospital is expanding cardiovascular and radiology imaging services with the addition of a nuclear medicine dual-head SPECT camera. These changes expand our services and give patients more care options closer to home. Nuclear medicine uses small amounts of radioactive material to diagnose, evaluate or treat a variety of diseases, including many types of cancer, heart disease, gastrointestinal, endocrine or neurological disorders.

Beginning August 11, the emergency department (ED) will be launching a pediatric observation program. This program has been developed with strong collaboration between Zeeland Community Hospital ED and Spectrum Health Helen DeVos Children's Hospital physicians. As part of the new program, regional hospital emergency room employees receive additional training and education on pediatric observation care. Keeping these patients for observation here instead of sending them to Grand Rapids will decrease the unnecessary travel burden for these local families.

Later this year we will be unveiling details regarding an exciting upcoming facility expansion. Stay tuned for that announcement coming soon!
