December 10 Luncheon Pizitz Middle School Girls Choir Holiday Performance

he Pizitz Middle School Girls' Choir was founded in 1999. Its founding purpose was to offer a more challenging musical atmosphere for girls at Pizitz who wanted more opportunities to learn and perform choral music. This 75-member choir consists of both seventh and eighth grade girls who are selected through an audition process based on vocal skills, sight-reading, ear training, and musicianship. Members of this group are involved in a variety of extracurricular activities such as; volleyball, basketball, dance team, cheerleaders, school and community theatre, softball, majorettes, math team, scholars bowl, bowling, tennis, soccer, golf, and school ambassadors.

Over the tenure of the group's existence, the Girls' Choir has given concerts for several Alabama Senators, Congressman and Governors, in St. John's Cathedral and St. Paul's Cathedral in New York City, and The National Cathedral and the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate

On Christmas Eve, it is customary to strip naked and take a long and respectful stint in the sauna. After the sauna session, Finns head out to the evening celebrations - while spirits of those ancestors take their place.

I do not know about you, but this tradition sounds a little awkward to me for those big Christmas family gatherings.

<u>South Africa</u> - When you think of Christmas food, ham and turkey are often high on the list. In South Africa, however, local children look forward to fried caterpillars at Christmas time. Not just any caterpillar but the Pine Tree Emperor Moth or (you guessed it) the Christmas caterpillar which is covered in very festive hues - giving all who swallow it a little extra luck in the coming year.

This tradition seems a little "creepy" to me.

<u>Spain</u> - Easily a most outlandish Christmas tradition, meet Tió de Nadal, the Christmas poop log. Tió de Nadal is made from a hollow log, with stick legs, a smile, and a red hat. Every evening between December 8th and Christmas Eve, the children feed the log small treats with water, and leave him under a blanket to keep him warm. On Christmas Eve, after Tió de Nadal is properly beaten and serenaded with traditional Christmas songs, the log magically poops out presents and candy - where he is then considered useless and thrown in the fire for warmth. Candy from a poop log! I will pass on that one.
