

### Severe Weather Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday

Alabama's annual severe weather preparedness sales tax holiday begins at 12:01 a.m. Friday, Feb. 22, 2019, and ends at midnight, Sunday, Feb. 24, 2019, allowing Alabama shoppers to stock up tax free on common supplies costing less than \$60 that every home and business needs to prepare for a natural disaster or even a general emergency. Generators costing \$1,000 or less are also included in the sales tax holiday. Visit www.revenue.alabama.gov/salestax for more information.

\*Please note: Jefferson County has waived the 1% sales and use tax, but not the 1% Special Revenue sales tax. State and Vestavia Hills city sales taxes will be completely waived.

In his capacity as President he helped implement the initial class of Youth Leadership Vestavia Hills (YLVH) with Kelly Bottcher and Kym Prewitt as mentors (this was the realization of an LVH project!) and revamped the Citizen of the Year event to the committee-driven model that it is today. As a Board member he chaired the Citizen of the Year Committee in 2010, mentored many LVH project groups over the years, organized and moderated numerous Economic Day classes and Government Day classes as co-chair.

Robin also served on Mayor McCallum's Long-Range Planning Committee which, at the time, analyzed the potential annexation of Cahaba Heights and created the current Strategic Plan (later called the Comprehensive Plan) for Vestavia Hills. He is currently on the board of the Collectors Circle for Contemporary Art of the Birmingham Museum of Art.

Robin is a graduate of Washington and Lee University. His major addictions are hearing live music, collecting contemporary art, travel, and playing guitar. Robin has two grown children; Rob, who is working in the family business, and Alison, a talented interior designer and real estate agent who lives in Washinton, D.C.
